A New Beginning: Carmen's Journey to Safety and Self-Reliance

Carmen Ortiz was born in Charco, Nariño, Colombia. At 11, her family relocated to Buenaventura, where she finished high school and watched her father build a small business. Violence in the region forced the family to move again — this time to Bogotá, in search of safety and stability.

In Bogotá, Carmen reconnected with a childhood friend who would become her life partner. Together, they launched Frutería, a fruit-selling business Carmen successfully operated for 17 years. During that time, she also became a mother to her son, Adiel Jesús

In 2023, violence once again disrupted their lives. Fearing for their safety, Carmen and Adiel fled to Ecuador and applied for asylum through the International Organization for Migration (IOM). Life in Ecuador was grueling.

"We were homeless. I had to sleep with my son under a bridge," she recalls. "He got sick and had to be hospitalized."

BALLARD SUMMER MEAL PROGRAM YEAR END REVIEW



The summer is over, and the Ballard Summer Meal Program is wrapping up for the year. Kathy and Eileen are in the process of closing the books for the year. Unfortunately, not all of the bills have been submitted yet, so we aren't sure where we stand with the money that we have left over to start next year. But we do have some information about the number of meals and the amount of food purchased.

- Number of children registered: 162
- Number of children self-reporting on Free or Reduced meals: 82
- Total Meals Made in June: 1009
- Average weekly meals made in June: 252.25
- Total Meals Made in July: 898
- Average weekly meals made in July: 224.5
- Total Meals Made in August: 595
- Average weekly meals made in August: 198.3

Favorite meals: Uncrustables, French Toast Sticks, mini pizza, and Chicken nuggets How many chicken nuggets did we serve? The total nuggets served 5,500! We also served 1,200 sausage links and 1,845 French Toast sticks. But we only served 268 mini pizzas because we didn't get the recipe for those until late July.

Volunteers were probably the most important part of the whole summer! Without the help of the volunteers, we would not have been able to accomplish our goal of feeding the Ballard children. Each week we needed to fill 75 volunteer hours. (Meal prep was 5 people for 5 hours, 3 distribution sites required 3 people, and 2 people to drive the meals to Cambridge and Slater. We did have a number of people who volunteered every week, and one person who volunteered 19 out of 24 days!!

Total volunteer hours: 900+

Total volunteers: 49+ people (some people showed up and didn't complete the sign-up sheet)

Total high school student service hours: 187

In September we will have a Thank You event for our volunteers. We want them to know how appreciated that they are. We also may be trying to get some feedback on what we need to change for next year.

The Ladies Group meets every Monday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.



Ways to Serve

Lutheran World Relief School Bags

It's time to shop for school supplies! Please pick up one or more LWR school bag(s) from the tote in the back of the sanctuary. Return the filled bags to the larger tote located in the back of the sanctuary. You can also just buy quantities of individual items and bring them to the church; then volunteers will put the kits together. These bags will be shipped in the fall to Lutheran World Relief. This is a project of Fjeldberg Congregation and the FLC Sewing Circle.

Supply List:

- Four (4) 70-sheet spiral notebooks of wide ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2". NO loose-leaf paper.
- One (1) blunt scissors (safety scissors with imbedded steel blades work well.
- One (1) 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters one one side and inches on the other.
- One (1) pencil sharpener.



- Five (5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers.
 Secure together with a rubber band.
- One (1) eraser



- Five (5) ballpoint pens (NO gel ink). Secured together with a rubber band.
- One (1) box of 16 or 24 crayons.



If you are packing your own bags DO NOT add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Remove any excess packaging and pack items in the bag. Return the filled bags to the church by **September 21st.**
