A reading from Paul's Letter to the Colossians.

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers-- all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him-- provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. 

## Acolytes, Readers, and Ushers, Oh My!

Church doesn't happen without the support of **many** volunteers. Are you interested in joining the St. Mark's Ministry Volunteer team? At St. Mark's we use a computer program called *Ministry Scheduler* to make assignments. As a volunteer, you let us know about your availability and service preferences, and you are able to request a substitute, or volunteer to fill in if there is an unexpected opening.


We need volunteers for all of the ministries described below:

**Acolytes** — Acolytes carry the cross and torches in and out of the church and lead the Gospel Procession. They also assist the clergy preparing for the Eucharist. They ring the sanctus bells and wear white albs. Acolytes need to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the service in order to “get vested”—(i.e. Put on the alb and tie the cincture.)



Acolyting is open to anyone from 3rd grade through adulthood. If you enjoy leading and serving, and want to be part of the entire service, Acolyting is a great choice. There will be an *Acolyte Refresher and Training Session* on **Wednesday, August 20 from 6:30 - 7:30 p.m.** New and returning acolytes are encouraged to attend.

**Readers** — Readers read the lessons from the pulpit. Each Sunday, one or two lessons are read, along with the Prayers of the People. If you enjoy reading aloud in front of people, this may be the ministry for you. A training session for *Readers and Chalice/Cup Bearers* is scheduled for **Sunday, August 24 from 9:45 - 10:15 a.m.**



**Chalice/Cup Bearers** — Chalice/Cup Bearers serve the wine at the Eucharist. They administer the wine either using the Common Cup (Chalice) or individual cups and say, “The blood of Christ, the cup of Salvation.” This is a meaningful ministry as you address each individual coming for communion. A training session for *Readers and Chalice/Cup Bearers* is scheduled for **Sunday, August 24 from 9:45 - 10:15 a.m.**



**Ushers** — Ushers are the face of St. Mark's for each person who attends. The ushers greet people as they enter the church, invite them to make a name tag and hand them a bulletin. They count the number of people in attendance, pass the offering plates, and guide people to the altar for the Eucharist. Ushers need to arrive 15 minutes early in order to provide a welcome to all attending church. *Usher Training* is scheduled for **Sunday, August 17 from 9:45 - 10:15 a.m.**








For June 2025, St. Mark's YTD operating net was a surplus of \$38,702, which was above the YTD budget by \$7,014. Actual pledges received YTD of \$348,093 were below budget by \$5,130. Unpledged, openplate and other donations were below budget by \$7,836. St. Mark's cash available for current operations is \$191,684. St. Mark's continues to have significant liabilities - the Church Building Mortgage and the Diocesan Loan. ## Branching Out Into The World...

At St. Mark's our Vision statement is, "*Rooted in Baptism, Growing in Faith, Branching Out into the World.*"

Today and during this week, we will be praying for the state of **Missouri**. You may want to explore this state during the week.



Humans have inhabited present-day Missouri for at least 12,000 years. The Mississippian culture, which emerged in the ninth century, built cities with pyramidal and other ceremonial mounds before declining in the 14th century. The Indigenous Osage and Missouri nations inhabited the area when European people arrived in the 17th century. The French incorporated the territory into Louisiana, founding Ste. Genevieve in 1735 and St. Louis in 1764. After a brief period of Spanish rule, the United States acquired Missouri as part of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803. Americans from the Upland South rushed into the new Missouri Territory, taking advantage of its productive agricultural plains; Missouri played a central role in the westward expansion of the United States.<sup>[5]</sup> Missouri was admitted as a slave state as part of the Missouri Compromise of 1820. As a border state, Missouri's role in the American Civil War was complex, and it was subject to rival governments, raids, and guerilla warfare. After the war, both Greater St. Louis and the Kansas City metropolitan area became large centers of industrialization and business.

Today the state is divided into 114 counties and the independent city of St. Louis. Missouri has been called the "Gateway to the West",<sup>[6]</sup> the "Mother of the West", the "Cave State", and the "Show Me State".<sup>[7]</sup> Its culture blends elements of the Midwestern and Southern United States. It is the birthplace of the musical genres ragtime, Kansas City jazz and St. Louis blues. The well-known Kansas City-style barbecue, and the lesser-known St. Louis-style barbecue, can be found across the state and beyond.
