Jesus reminded Mary that this was not the focal point of Obviously, Joseph was dead, and Jesus' brothers did not believe in Him. There was no one to whom Mary could turn, but her thirty-three-year-old Son made sure that she would have someone. Mary had experienced tremendous heartache as she watched her Son face growing hostility from religious leaders. Now she stood near the cross witnessing His horrific death. And as she sorrowed for her Son's suffering, Jesus appointed her caretaker. This was the final punctuation to His earthly relationship to her. Mary had nurtured the baby born in Bethlehem, had attended to the young boy in Nazareth, and had ultimately followed

To be certain, there had been moments in His ministry when Christ had to clarify His relationship to His mother. Remember when Joseph and Mary left the twelve-yearold Jesus at the temple (kinda like some of us who were inadvertently left at church when we were children)? When they returned to find Him, Mary asked, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you" (Luke 2:48 HCSB). Can't you hear your mother scolding you like this? "Why have you worried your mom like this?" she inquired. And Jesus' response? He declared that He had to be about His Father's business (Luke 2:49). In essence, He underscored His identity as the Son of God Himself.

Him as Master. All of that was at an end.

In another instance, the Lord confronted Mary when she tried to force Him into premature ministry. The event this weekend!

His ministry and that He would not be forced by maternal prompting. You might say He set a healthy boundary that is worthy of emulation.

A final scene that informs us of the Lord's relationship with His earthly mother is found in Matthew 12:46-50. According to the text, Jesus' mother and brothers approached Him to seek an audience with Him. They (I believe, specifically Mary) sent a messenger to Him suggesting that they were waiting to talk to Him. However, Jesus was not controlled by their requests. He pointed out that His true family were those who obeyed the Father's will.

I do not rehearse these events in order to turn you against your mother. (Can you imagine the mail I would receive for such suggestion?) Rather, I want you to see that Jesus had a healthy relationship with His mom—one of love AND emancipation. The Lord had successfully grown into a Man, and on the cross, He clearly communicated that truth by commanding John to care for Mary. She had given up a Son to ministry and suffering, but she had gotten back a Man Who could provide for her. This God Man would not only meet her physical need through the Beloved Disciple, but He would also offer her salvation. What a Son! This Mother's Day let's celebrate those moms who nurtured us and pointed us in the right way. And let's also strive for healthy relationships in our families as we look to the Lord! May God bless our moms and help us as we honor them




