Then Mordecai told them to reply to Esther, "Do not think to yourself that in the king's palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. For if you keep silent at this time, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another place, but you and your father's house will perish. And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"

Then Esther told them to reply to Mordecai, "Go, gather all the Jews to be found in Susa, and hold a fast on my behalf, and do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my young women will also fast as you do. Then I will go to the king, though it is against the law, and if I perish, I perish."—Esther 4:13-16

The Bible contains 66 books, and there is one book that has a unique feature. There is one book that doesn't mention God; not even once! Which book do you think it might be?

It is the 10-chapter book of Esther! For 10 chapters, God is not named or mentioned as the brave and beautiful queen saves the Jews in exile with the help of her wise relative Mordecai. It seems strange that a book about how God's people are saved doesn't mention Him...at all.

However, God is at work behind the scenes, orchestrating and guiding the events that unfold. While God is not explicitly mentioned, He is certainly at work. It culminates with the book's most famous verse. Mordecai tells Queen Esther, "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" God was certainly directing affairs behind the scenes so that His people might be saved from destruction. God had directed the events that led to Esther becoming queen, and He had instilled in her the bravery and courage needed for the task at hand. Just a few verses later, she says, "Then I will go to the king, though it is against the law, and if I perish, I perish."

I'm not bothered that the book of Esther doesn't mention God. Why? I think it's because Esther perfectly depicts our lives on this side of heaven. We don't often get to see God explicitly working in our lives, <u>but He is</u>, <u>and He does</u>. He has set us here at this specific place (right here in Conover), and for this particular time. He has a purpose for us (a purpose <u>for you!</u>), to make a difference in this community and for God's people. He is doing His renewing and saving work in us.

As we continue to live out our days on this side of heaven, let's rejoice in our God who works in ways we don't always explicitly see. Let's rejoice in a God who showers His good gifts upon us: His grace, salvation, love, and care. Let's celebrate that we have a God who has set us here for such a time as this!
