When Plans Have Problems

With Spring right around the corner, we have started making plans for the summer. We've already begun mapping out all the things we want to do, but things rarely go exactly as planned. As the Bible says, "Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails" (Prov. 19:21).

The truth is, things don't always go as planned, and problems rarely fit into the picture we've painted. The question is, how do we handle it when things don't go our way? What do we do when problems interfere with our plans? The reality is, we don't always respond the right way, do we?

In John 6:1-14, the story begins with the disciples finishing their ministry for the day as evening approached. A massive crowd of people were not ready to leave, and they needed food. Jesus saw this as an opportunity to teach His disciples how to respond when things weren't going as expected. He shows us that it's okay when we face problems because He always has a plan. So, the next time you encounter a challenge, remember that Jesus has a purpose for your problem.

Jesus asked the disciples to feed the people. In other words, He was asking, "How are we going to handle this unexpected situation?"

Don't you love their responses? Some wanted to give up and send the people away. Philip said, "Let's throw money at it; money will fix it." Andrew suggested, "Let's look to others; maybe someone else will take care of it." Isn't that often our reaction to our problems? When things don't go as planned, we feel like giving up, throwing money at the issue, or hoping someone else will handle it.

But Jesus had a plan all along, even before the problem appeared. He already knew what they were going to face and was preparing a solution before they even realized there was an issue. Sometimes, the problem is part of the plan.

Many pastors have taught how God uses our problems to accomplish His purposes. Even when things aren't going our way, God is at work through them.

Here are a few ways God accomplishes His plan in the midst of our problems:

- God uses problems to direct us: Sometimes, God needs to light a fire under us to get us moving. Problems can help point us in new directions and motivate us to change. Often, it takes a painful situation to lead us to where we need to be (Prov. 20:30).
- God uses problems to inspect you: People are like teabags—if you want to know what's inside, drop them in hot water. What's truly in us is revealed during trials. Has God ever tested your faith through a problem? What do your struggles reveal about you? (James 1:2-3).
- God uses problems to protect us: A problem can be a blessing in disguise. There's a famous saying:
 "Man's rejection is God's protection." What seems like a setback may actually be God redirecting us for our
 good (Gen. 50:20).
- God uses problems to perfect us: When handled correctly, problems build character. God cares more about developing our character than ensuring our comfort (Romans 5:3-4).

Here's the point: God is at work in your life, even when you don't recognize it or understand it. The next time you face a problem, remember that God's plan is greater than your own, and He is already working things out for your good (Romans 8:28).
