This week in our Bible studies we're focusing on the story of Jesus walking on the waters. You'll remember the story. Right after the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus sent the disciples ahead to the other side of the Sea of Galilee while he remained behind for some solitary prayer time.

As they made their way across, a storm rose up that hindered them. They were struggling. Late in the night, suddenly they saw a figure (Jesus) walking out on the waters. The disciples became panicked and "terrified." However, immediately Jesus spoke a word to calm their hearts.

Confused and unsure, Peter challenged, "Lord, if it's you, tell me to come to you on the water."

When Peter stepped out of the boat and walked on the water, he experienced a miracle. What Peter experienced was literally phenomenal. But then something happened. He took his eyes off of Jesus and when he did, he began to sink. "But when he saw the strong wind and the waves, he was terrified and began to sink. "Save me, Lord!" he shouted." (Matthew 14:30, NLT)

Peter took his eyes off the Lord, put them on the storm, and disrupted the miracle. That's a spiritual truth for all of us. If at any point we take the focus off of Jesus, we will sink. Our futures will sink. Our plans will sink. Our ministries will sink. We will sink.

Don't allow the winds and waves of chaos to steal your focus. When Jesus is the center, several things happen.

#1 Perfect Peace — First, when Jesus remains your focus, your heart is filled with perfect peace. Isaiah 26:3 says: "You [God] will keep in perfect peace all who trust in You, all whose thoughts are fixed on You!"

#2 True Unity — Second, when Jesus remains your focus, you'll experience true unity with fellow believers. Focused on the Lord, you won't become distracted by the "winds and waves" of anything in this world that might cause seek to pull us away from Christ or one another [hmmmm, including politics?]. When we focus on Jesus, we focus on who unites us — Jesus, rather than on what has the potential to divide us. 1 Corinthians 12:13 says we were "all baptized into one Body by one Spirit, and we all share the same Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:13, NLT)

#3 Spiritual Stability — You become firmly established. You won't be moved by whatever opinion or trend is being floated in front of you. You'll abide faithfully, steadfastly to Jesus' values. Nothing will be able to shake you. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "Anyone who listens to My words and follows them will be like a person who built his house on solid rock. (Matthew 7:24)

#4 Effectiveness — Finally, when Jesus remains your focus, you remain effective. You know, Jesus is still the answer, and the gospel is still our mission. Sometimes we have the tendency to get off message. When Jesus remains your focus, He remains your message. When that happens, you remain effective.



So if the winds and the waves are around, keep your eyes on Jesus. When the storm passes, you'll look back and say, "I stood faithful. I kept my joy, my love, my peace." Keep your eyes on Jesus."




More information about Balls Creek Camp Meeting
