OUT OF THE WOODS — Thinking about "Hands"

Back in the 15th century, in a tiny village near Nuremberg, Germany lived a family with 18 children. Eighteen! Just to keep food on the table, the father toiled 18 hours a day at his trade.

Despite their seemingly hopeless condition, two of the father's children had a dream. They both wanted to pursue their talent for art, but they knew full well their father would never be financially able to send either of them to study at the Academy.

After many long discussions in their crowded bed, the two boys worked out a pact. They would toss a coin. The loser would go to work in the nearby mines and, with his earnings, support the other brother at the Academy. Then, in four years, when the first brother completed his studies, they would switch. That way, both would eventually be able to go to school.

They tossed a coin one Sunday after church. Albrecht won the toss and went off to Nuremberg, Albert went down into the dangerous mines and, for the next four years, financed his brother, whose art at the Academy caused an immediate sensation. Albrecht's etchings, his woodcuts, and his oils were even far better than most of his professors, and by the time he graduated, he was beginning to earn considerable fees for his commissioned works.

When the young artist returned home, the family held a dinner to celebrate Albrecht's triumphant homecoming. After the meal, Albrecht rose to offer a toast to his beloved brother for the years of sacrifice that had enabled him to fulfill his ambition. His closing words were, "And now, Albert, blessed brother of mine, now it is your turn. Now you can go to Nuremberg to pursue your dream, and I will take care of you." All heads turned to the far end of the table where Albert sat, with tears streaming down his pale face, as he sobbed. No ...no ...no" he said.

Finally, Albert wiped the tears from his cheeks. He glanced down the table at the faces he loved, and then, holding his hands close to his cheek, he said softly, "No, brother. I cannot go to Nuremberg, It is too late for me. Look what four years in the mines have done to my hands! The bones in every finger have been smashed at least once, and lately I have been suffering from arthritis so badly that I cannot even hold a glass to return your toast. much less make delicate lines on parchment or canvas with a pen or a brush. No, brother ... for me it is too late."

Today, Albrecht Dürer's masterful portraits, sketches, charcoals & woodcuts hand in many museums, but I bet you're only familiar with one of his works. In fact, you may well have grown up with a copy hanging in your home.

One day, to pay homage to his brother for all that he had sacrificed. Albrecht painstakingly drew his brother's battered hands with palms together and thin fingers stretched skyward. He called his powerful drawing simply "Hands," but the world almost immediately opened their hearts to his great masterpiece and renamed his tribute of love "The Praying Hands." The next time you see a copy, take a second look. Let it be your reminder that no one - no one - ever makes it alone!




We will meet at the theater. Everyone will purchase their own tickets (in advance, if possible). Watch for announcements closer to the date regarding showtime.
