It's the Super Bowl of the Skies! No ticket required. In a world of people addicted to screens, countless millions of us stopped everything to see a spectacle in the skies. A celestial switch was flipped and the lights went out. Total solar eclipses don't come around very often. When they do occur, they become major cultural events. Many people traveled hundreds of miles to be in the path of totality, so they could view the full effect of the eclipse. Many more followed the live coverage on their smartphones, eager to watch the cosmic drama unfold.

But whether on the ground or online, the sight of the moon blotting out the sun and then turning it into a celestial diamond ring created a moment of transcendent wonder. For Christians, that sense of wonder was even more acute, a vivid embodiment of the opening words of Psalm 19: "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims His handiwork."

It makes we wonder, in what way, exactly, does a solar eclipse declare the glory of God? Well, first it reminds us that we live in a finely tuned cosmos.

Since total solar eclipses are so rare, it's tempting to think of them as random coincidences of nature. But they're nothing of the sort. In reality, they follow a complex pattern of physical and mathematical rules that make it possible to predict them years in advance, as people have been doing since ancient times. This pattern depends on the sun, moon and earth having exactly the right size, composition, relative distance and motion with respect to each other.

If there were any variation in any of these properties, total eclipses might never occur.

These physical properties of the earth, moon and sun are part of a larger, vastly more complex pattern of cosmic variables, all of which must be precisely as they are for life on earth to exist. The odds of them all falling into place by pure chance is, in a word, astronomical. Taken together, they offer powerful evidence of what scientists call "universal fine tuning." Far from being the product of random processes, the universe is as its name implies: a created order designed by the unfathomable wisdom of a Creator God.

Second, throughout history, eclipses have been interpreted as bad omens or portents of doom. Across many cultures, they've been explained in terms of mythical beasts or demons devouring the sun. In fact, the modern term "eclipse" derives from an Ancient Greek word meaning to abandon or to forsake. The subtext is evident: the sun, the source of light and life, has failed and forsaken the world.

The Gospel writers record a similar celestial event that occurred during the Crucifixion. The Bible tells us that "about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, 'Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?' that is, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

The parallel is unmistakable between the light of the sun failing and the Son being forsaken by His Father. But once Jesus had finished His work and paid the full penalty for sin, the darkness ended, and the sun returned.

The darkness of an eclipse is just for a moment, but can't block the light for long, any more than the tomb could hold Jesus for long. Because of the Resurrection, mercy triumphs over judgment (James 2:13). Charles Spurgeon, the great 19th century preacher, expressed this truth most eloquently: A total eclipse is one of the most terrible and grand sights that ever will be seen. But thank God, whatever eclipse happens to a Christian, it is never a total eclipse. There is always a ring of comfort left. There is always a crescent of love and mercy to shine upon God's child.

So, let's not wait until the next eclipse to stop and pause and wonder. Look up to the heavens, and then look further up, until you find joy in the God who enjoys His handiwork.

EVEN MORE NEWS TO USE

LIFE LINE SCREENING COMING MAY 16th

Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at First Methodist Church of Conover on Thursday, May 16, 2024. A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered:

Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.

These 4 vital screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.
