What Makes a Successful Church?

The answer to that question depends on whom you ask. Most people think a successful church is measured in large numbers, big budgets, programs that meet their needs, and state-of-the- art facilities.

However, none of those "standards" are proof of success. In fact, each one of those characteristics could just as well be present in a dead church. Do you remember the church at Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6)? This was a church that had a good reputation and was alive and well in the eyes of the community, but in the eyes of God, they were dead (Revelation 3:1).

Apparently, God doesn't see as we see (Isaiah 55:8-9), and He doesn't measure success in the same way that we do. While there is nothing wrong with numbers, programs, big budgets, and large facilities, a church can be successful in the eyes of God without focusing on these qualities.

What, then, is the measure of a successful church?

Christians who humbly try to live out the Lordship of Jesus in their lives daily.

Christians who love scripturally revealed truth supremely, who will not allow their own personal desires or situations to skew their perception of God's revelation and hopes for His Kingdom.

Christians who are committed to moral living and are more concerned with godliness than fitting in with society.

Christians who love peace and fellowship in Christ more than they do a fight and who love the calmness of unity more than the rhetoric of a fuss.

Christians who support the weary and weak, restore the fallen, and reaffirm their love and commitment to those who have stumbled.

Now, these characteristics would make a successful church! And note: It's not about size or other outward measures. Rather, it's about inward transformation and spirituality. We can have a vibrant church with meaningful discipleship and ministries without megachurch numbers, multi-million-dollar budgets, or cutting-edge-state-of-the-art facilities. The qualities that bring success and constitute greatness in God's eyes are within our reach. The present and future success of First Methodist Church of Conover begins with you and me.

As our Visioning Team has been seeking the Lord's guidance, wisdom and direction for the next few years, I am excited about what I'm hearing. My heart rate has quickened as our team has begun to put together a plan for the next step in our journey of following Jesus. I'm so glad you're a part of where we are headed!


