Acts 2:46-47

It is clear in the Bible that sharing a meal is one of the ways relationships are established, deepened, and enjoyed. The Old Testament prophets often described life in the new heavens and earth as a divine banqueting table (Isa. 25:6; 55:1–2). In the New Testament, Jesus often reclined "at table" during His earthly ministry, engaging with people, furthering His kingdom work, fostering community, demonstrating reconciliation with God, and building genuine fellowship among His disciples (Luke 5:29; 7:36; 11:37; 14:15). The early church gathered regularly in homes to "break bread together" as an expression of their fellowship in Christ (Acts 2:46). And of course, Jesus calls us to gather around His Communion Table where we enjoy fellowship with Him and with our brothers and sisters (Luke 22:19–20; 1 Cor. 10:15–17).

Christians enjoy sharing a meal because of the rich Biblical symbolism; because it is a tangible expression of service, love, and unity; and because of the opportunity it affords for fellowship and community. Practically, sharing a meal nourishes our need to know and be known because it facilitates face-to-face conversation. (excerpts from "Eating Together" by David Camera)
