Wouldn't it be nice to have *future binoculars* (lenses that would reveal the future)? If I had them, I could have saved myself a lot of grief over the years. You too?



While we don't have future binoculars, we have something even more valuable: faith. By faith, we are assured of a future we can't see (yet). How so? Seeing the future would be seeing outcomes. Faith is trusting in God regardless of outcomes.

And if we could see outcomes, we would trust in them more than we would trust in God. But because we trust in God's promises, character, and integrity—<u>who</u> He is—more than <u>what</u> we see, want, or expect, we can be confident of our future even if we don't know the outcomes in advance.

But to be sure, the Lord DOES have hopes and intentions for His work among us. My mind turns again to that passage from Jeremiah: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." – Jeremiah 29:11

With that in mind, I want to urge us as a church family to continue to prayerfully look ahead to what the Lord has in store for us. As I've said in worship several times lately, the Lord is moving ahead in new and exciting ways. And I believe He is calling us to follow after Him...to partner with Him, and to embrace what He wants to make happen right here in our midst at First Methodist and in our greater community.

Some of you have been part of our church family long enough to remember that 7 years ago, we created a Joel Committee who were tasked with discerning where the Lord was leading us in our ministries. They met multiple times and that vision was discussed, prayed over, and eventually adopted by our entire church. I am happy to report that this coming Sunday we will be announcing the fulfilment of yet another portion of that vision. [Note: This Sunday would be another really great Sunday to be worshiping with us so you might hear this announcement!]

By the way, all of this has happened <u>in spite</u> of the twin hurdles of a global pandemic and our denominational disaffiliation. HOW REMARKABLE! As we said last Sunday, "God is good....all the time!"

Now that we find ourselves on the cusp of nearly fulfilling the Joel Committee vision, I invite you to be in prayer about what the Lord is hoping to accomplish next.

Finally, I want you to hear that I believe whatever level of spirituality we now enjoy (in our church and in our lives); whatever degree of faith in Jesus Christ we now have; whatever strength of commitment and consecration; whatever degree of obedience, hope, or charity is ours; and whatever level of abilities we have already obtained — it will not be sufficient for the wonderful and amazing work that lies ahead. We must continue to lean even more firmly onto that Solid Rock which is Jesus Christ. There was a song a long time ago with lyrics that said: "My future's so bright, I gotta wear shades."

So it is for First Methodist Church. Grab your sunglasses!


