Thu 8/28	 Athens & Ancient Corinth 6:30 a.m. Breakfast 7:50 a.m. Meet Mrs. Maria in the lobby. We will tour the city of Athens - one of the most glorious cities in the world and the cradle of western civilization. Ancient yet modern, classic yet creative, traditional yet constantly changing Athens is a city of memorable contrasts. The past and the present of Athens unfolds before your eyes while we drive around the city's highlight spots and monuments like the Temple of Zeus, the Old Stadium, Syntagma square, the Parliament and the Tomb to the Unknown soldier, the Academy, the Library, and the National Gardens. On the natural fortress of the Acropolis, reinforced by the hand of man, stand the Propylaea, the temple of the Winged Victory, Erechtheion with the Porch of the Caryatids and, towering over all, and the majestic Parthenon. A winding path leads to the treasure of antiquity. Visible are the relics of the civilization of which we are the proud inheritors. Head toward ancient Corinth (Acts 18.1-18). It was in ancient Corinth where Paul came and worked, established a thriving church and writing two of the epistles, which are now part of the New Testament. We will see all the sites that are associated with his ministry: the Agora, the Temple of Apollo, the Roman Odeon, the Bema and Gallio's seat, the pillars, stairs, and the place of public worship, where Paul preached. All these visits will certainly enhance the understanding of Corinthians I and II. 	• 8:50 a.m. Meet Mrs. Maria in the lobby. Travel to Philippi , the town where Paul delivered his first sermon in Europe, sowing the seeds of Christianity. (Acts 16:11-12) "And from there (He went) to Philippi, which is the leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman Colony. We remained in this city some days" (Acts 16:11-12). Paul arrived here with Silas and Luke on the winter of AD 49-50. There the first Christian baptism was performed, of a woman named Lydia. Although they were prosecuted and arrested, they received God's help to escape from prison (Acts 16:25-26) where there was the conversion of the jailer (Acts 16:31). We will visit the Roman Theatre , probable site of the prison where Paul and Silas were arrested. We will continue towards the city of Kavala , the ancient city of Neapolis (Acts 16:11) where Paul landed with his disciples, Timothy and Silas. It was later renamed Christoupolis, meaning city of Christ, because it was the first European city to accept Christianity. We will visit the Roman Aqueduct and the ruins of the Acropolis . "Ephesus receives praise for its perseverance, but criticism for forsaking its "first love" (Rev. 2:1-7). You will explore the well-preserved ancient structures including the fountain of Trajan, Baths of Scolastika, Temple of Hadrian, Library of Celsus, and the Great Theatre capable of holding 25000 spectators where Paul preached and where the riot of the silversmiths occurred. - 9:20 a.m. Meet Guide Mrs. Daniella Venditti for full-day tour on St. Paul's life and witness in Rome.
- 10:00 a.m. Our tour on the footsteps of St. Paul in Rome aims to show you the most important sites where the Apostle Paul spent time when he was brought to Rome in front of the Emperor Nero on request of St. Paul himself. During the 3-hour tour you will stop in the Mamertine Prison, an ancient Roman prison from the 5 century B.C. used by the Romans to imprison those condemned to death before the final execution. The prison is a very famous place all round the world because the Apostles St. Peter and St. Paul were both prisoned here and they baptized many prisoners, gave them the strength and faith. St. Paul was executed under the Emperor Nero in the 67 A.D. because of the Christian's persecution.
- Go to the Abbey of the 3 Fountains along the Laurentina Road, where St. Paul was martyred.
- From the Abbey of the 3 Fontane, you will go to the **Vatican Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls**, where there the tomb of the Saint is located. The Basilica is one of the 7 Basilicas with the privilege of extra-territoriality and it is spectacular. Once inside you will see St. Paul's tomb.
