

Summary

Pastor Henry preached from Colossians 2:1-15, focusing on what drives our lives and Paul's purpose for the Colossian church. Paul's driving passion was threefold: to encourage believers, unite them in love, and help them understand the mystery of God revealed in Christ. The sermon emphasized that believers are complete in Christ, having been spiritually circumcised, buried and raised with Him in baptism, and freed from the condemnation of the law through the cross. Paul warned against hollow philosophies and reminded the church that Christ has disarmed spiritual powers and authorities, giving believers victory over evil. The message called for continued spiritual growth, community witness, and overflowing thankfulness as responses to what Christ has accomplished.

Questions

1. Paul talks about what drives him in ministry. What would you say currently drives or motivates you in your daily life?
2. How can we practically encourage one another in our church community, and why is this so important?
3. What does it mean to be 'united in love' while still allowing for different opinions and perspectives?
4. Paul warns against 'hollow and deceptive philosophy.' What are some modern-day philosophies or

worldviews that might compete with Christ for our allegiance?

5. The sermon mentioned that in Christ 'all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form.' How should this truth impact how we view Jesus compared to other religious figures or teachings?
6. Paul says our sins have been 'nailed to the cross.' How does this truth help us deal with guilt and regret from past mistakes?
7. What does it mean that Christ has 'disarmed the powers and authorities'? How should this give us confidence in facing spiritual battles or evil in our world?
8. The pastor challenged us to be 'overwhelmed with gratitude.' What are some specific things you can thank God for this week that demonstrate His goodness in your life?

Life Application

This week, intentionally encourage at least one person in your church community through a note, text, or conversation. Also, spend time each day reflecting on what Christ has done for you and express specific gratitude to God for His salvation and daily blessings.
