WEEK TWO - CALLING

WELCOME EVERYONE. *Let them know your purpose is to point them in the right direction and say "Go after it!"*

SCRIPTURAL BASIS FOR CALLING (10 MINUTES)

MOSES - Read Exodus 3

God prepares Moses - he was raised in Pharaoh's home, is a master of the Egyptian language, he's well educated in leadership...all the things needed to lead thousands of Hebrews, he has it.

PAUL - Read Acts 9:15

Eventhough this man actively persecuted the Church, he has an encounter with Jesus and prepares a hardened Pharisee Jewish man to reach the Gentiles - he is highly educated, can read and write, and has a deep understanding of the Jewish Scriptures.

NEHEMIAH- *What happens if God's call doesn't come in the form of a burning bush or an encounter on a road?*

→ NEHEMIAH'S CALLING

Nehemiah gets word of the state of his homeland.

NEHEMIAH 1:3 (NIV)

They said to me, "Those who survived the exile and are back in the province are in great trouble and disgrace. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates have been burned with fire."

Nehemiah's reaction. *[His calling started as a concern.]*

NEHEMIAH 1:4 (NIV)

When I heard these things, I **sat down and wept**. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven.

→ PERSONAL REFLECTION (10 MINUTES)

What concerns you?

Callings are often born in the soul of a man or woman who is gripped by a tension between what is and what should be.

What bothers you?

What should be?

Do any of these tensions listed above feel like a moral imperative?

Is there any connection between your various tensions and what God is up to in this world?

Little did Nehemiah know that God was setting him up to be a solution to the issue. A calling, if you will, to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

Maybe your burden will be an indication of a calling.

→ NEHEMIAH PRAYED

NEHEMIAH 1:5-11 (NIV)

Then I said: "LORD, the God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with those who love him and keep his commandments, 6 let your ear be attentive and your eyes open to hear the prayer your servant is praying before you day and night for your servants, the people of Israel.

I confess the sins we Israelites, including myself and my father's family, have committed against you.

7 We have acted very wickedly toward you. We have not obeyed the commands, decrees and laws you gave your servant Moses. 8 "Remember the instruction you gave your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the nations, 9 but if you return to me and obey my commands, then even if your exiled people are at the farthest horizon, I will gather them from there and bring them to the place I have chosen as a dwelling for my Name.' 10 "They are your servants and your people, whom you redeemed by your great strength and your mighty hand. 11 Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of this your servant and to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name. Give your servant success today by granting him favor in the presence of this man." I was cupbearer to the king.

What is one verse or statement that stood out to you in Nehemiah's prayer?

As a cup bearer of the king, he saw an opportunity to connect his passion with his position.
