



13.5% of all Stonegate gifts are dedicated to Missions. >40% of Stonegate Mission funds are prioritized to people groups with the least access to the Gospel - unreached people groups (UPG).

ONREACHED

OVER 16,000 DISTINCT PEOPLE GROUPS GLOBALLY

44% OF GROUPS ARE CONSIDERED UPG

Groups are considered unreached when <2% of their population is evangelical Christian. Almost 3 billion people fall into the category of UPGs.

43% OF UPGS ARE CONSIDERED UUPG

Unengaged Unreached People Groups are those with no accessible churches, no believers, no missionaries, and no one actively engaging with them spiritually.

FOR THE NATIONS REFUGEE OUTREACH

Serving refugees in the Dallas area from Africa, Asia, and the Middle East by enhancing education, helping people adapt to life in the U.S., and most importantly, sharing the good news of Jesus Christ.

SPOKEN WORLDWIDE

Breaking through the barriers of literacy and Bible poverty among the 2+ billion oral learners by "Delivering Truth... where written words can't go."

TORONTO CHURCH PLANTING

Catalyzing new church plants/planters among the unchurched and unbelievers in one of the world's most culturally diverse cities.



ELAM MINISTRIES

Strengthening and expanding the rapidly growing and severely persecuted church in the Iran region through discipleship, church planting, Christian resources and leadership training.



CHINA AID

Supporting the fast-growing, underground church of China through exposing human rights violations, advocating for persecuted Christians, and training Christian leaders.

HIS VOICE GLOBAL

ORAL BIBLE TRANSLATION AND PASTORAL TRAINING

In 2003, NGO start up, Voice for Humanity, invented a digital audio player for churches to use in their mission efforts. Initially, the device failed to attract the interest VFH expected - until early employees Pete McLain and Charles Madinger recognized an opportunity to test the technology. The first free and fair democratic election in Afghanistan was approaching, but in a country where most of the population could not read, information about the election remained inaccessible. In response, Pete and Charles began working with locals to produce and record 16 hours of stories, songs, and dramas in eight languages on 68,000 digital audio players. From there, Pete and Charles distributed the devices to small groups across Afghanistan. Through the audio players, locals were introduced to the principles of democracy and how it could work in their own country. After 6 months, three million people had listened to the recordings and their impact on the election was undeniable.

In 2005, Pete, Charles, and two board members decided to leave VFH to start T4 Global, know today as Spoken Worldwide. Their passion for community transformation drove their mission in reaching non-reading communities with the Gospel and education. Little did they know, on the other side of the country, Ed Weaver, current President of Spoken Worldwide, was exploring how MP3 players could be used on the mission field. Ed learned that 2/3 of the world's population did not use written communication and he saw audio technology as a way of finally reaching the unreached.

In 2007, Ed, Pete, and Charles met for the first time, and decided to join forces. Three months later, MPReach and T4 Global merged. Since 2007, Spoken Worldwide has spread to 12 countries and recorded over 70 languages. Their 3-fold missions is for Oral-Bible translation, local pastor development, and ministry coaching.

Recently, they again joined forces with world's leading Bible Translation agencies to share their resources to finish the task of translating God's Word into every heart language. They serve the Global movement, Illuminations, on their Orality and Innovation affinity teams.

The mission: to deliver Truth...where written words can't go.

PERSIAN EVANGELISM, BIBLE DISTRIBUTION, AND LEADER TRAINING

In 1990, Rev. Sam Yeghnazar founded Elam Ministries after serving 20 years as the pastor of a small Iranian church in London, which eventually became the largest congregation of Iranian Muslim converts outside of Iran. During his time as a pastor, Sam also served as a key leader in the United Bible Societies. Recognizing how open Iranians were to the Gospel, Sam left the UBS for full time ministry among Iranians. Sam's vision was to reach Persian-speaking people groups with the Gospel. To aid in this vision, Sam established Elam College – the only Persian-speaking residential Bible training center in the world. After its establishment, Elam began working with Wycliffe Bible Translators to create a new translation of Scripture in modern-day Persian. In 2014, the New Millennium Version was completed and David Yeghnazar, son of Sam Yeghnazar, was appointed Executive Director of Elam.

Elam has served the Iran region through a three-part mission:

Train ... Persian-speaking leaders for ministry

Equip ... the Persian-speaking church with Bibles and resources for evangelism and discipleship Send ... the Gospel through trained evangelists, church planters and the media into the Persian-speaking world

Since Elam was founded, it has grown to include programs for leadership development and discipleship, church planting, Scripture printing and distribution, women's ministry, men's ministry, next generation ministry, marriage and family ministry, satellite TV and media ministry, resource translation and development, advocacy and relief for persecuted Iranian Christians, and a growing ministry to Persian-speaking refugees in Iran and beyond.

Despite increasing hostility and persecution by the Iranian government, Elam continues to witness a rapid growth in the Iranian church and an increased hunger for the Gospel.

LEADER DEVELOPMENT AMONG THE VULNERABLE, INTEGRATIVE CARE, ARISE DISCIPLESHIP CENTER

As singles, Vernon and Amber Burger were drawn to serve the vulnerable in Africa. Both had taken trips to Africa prior to their meeting, and both felt God's call on their lives to see redemption, restoration, and renewal across generations in Africa. It wasn't until they crossed paths as church interns in Houston that they recognized their shared call to serve oversees.

In 2003, Vernon and Amber were married and prepared to move to South Sudan to start an orphan care ministry. However, political and social unrest ensued across Sudan, putting a halt on their plans. Soon after, the Burgers moved to Midland, Texas where they began re-evaluating how they could send support to South Sudan. In 2005, with the help of their community, the Burgers went on to build an orphanage, a school, a medical clinic, and a church in Sudan. It wasn't until 2007 that His Voice for Sudan was established, later to be renamed His Voice Global. In 2008, HVG went on to build a second orphanage.

By 2010, HVG had provided South Sudan with numerous jobs for widows and essential care for orphans. HVG was determined not just to care for the physical needs of the community but provide sustainable and lasting internal impact. Their goal – to raise leaders among the vulnerable. To do this, HVG established four programs: Thrive, Arise, Alive, and Shine. Each program designed to redeem, restore, and renew.

Thrive: The Thrive program provides financial and relational support for students pursuing higher education. This program currently serves students in Uganda, South Sudan, and Kenya, 6 full-time HVG mentors, a partnership with Rift Valley Hope in Kenya, and 10 University/Trade School Graduates in Uganda.

Arise: The Arise Center was built in 2019 to provide a safe, accessible, and welcoming place for discipleship training of indigenous leaders. It also serves as a gathering place, place of employment, rest stop for missionaries, and center for wellness classes.

Alive: The Alive program brings discipleship and leadership trainings to indigenous people groups most in need. This program also equips leaders to walk with people who've experienced trauma and provide the care and attention they need to thrive.

Shine: The Shine program is an integrative care program for the most vulnerable within the Arise Center community. It was recognized that most Arise members had at least one family member with a disability. Through the Shine program, individuals with a disability are provided with assistive/adaptive housing, employment opportunities, food, and clean water filters for better quality of life.







CHURCH PLANTING, LITERACY, AND CHILDREN'S BIBLE CLUBS

In 1971 a pastor from Michigan named John DeVries, traveled for the first time to India. John was immediately overwhelmed by the heat, the crowds, the smell, the beggars... and the undeniable need for the Gospel in India. On the flight home, John prayed what he called his "Jonah Prayer." India was the last place John wished to return, and he prayed for God to send him anywhere but back to India... God had other plans. During his trip, John had discovered a small group of passionate Christians in India. They were outnumbered, but highly motivated to reach their nation with the love of Christ. A partnership was born and in 1978, Mission India was founded. In the years that followed, Mission India formed three programs: Biblically-based Adult Literacy Classes, Church Planter Training, and Children's Bible Clubs.

Adult Literacy: A lack of education is one of the leading factors for India's poverty rate - and it's not just a lack of academics, but a lack in basic life skills. To combat this, Mission India created their Adult Literacy program. Classes are held daily after work and continue throughout the year. Classes cover: reading, writing, math, entrepreneurship, health & hygiene, spiritual development, socioeconomics, prenatal care, parenting, and more.

Church Planter Training: The leading factor in why millions in India do not follow Jesus is simply because they've never heard of Him. They've never met a follower of Christ, never heard the name Jesus, or even seen a Christian church. As a result, locals turn to idols or witch doctors because it is all they've ever known. In response, Mission India created a year long, hands-on training for local believers who desire to bring the Gospel to their own communities. These Church Planters learn and practice how to build a sustainable Christian community, lead families to Christ, start prayer groups, and establish new churches.

Children's Bible Clubs: Due to poverty, addiction, and lack of education, many parents cannot properly provide for their children. In many cases, parents lean heavily on their children for support. This imbalance increases children's risk for developing bad habits like stealing and alcoholism at a young age. To restore balance and strengthen the foundation of a healthy family unit, Mission India created two Children's Bible Clubs: a 10-Day Children's Club and Year-long Children's Club.

10-Day Bible Clubs: During the summer, children are invited to a VBS style program where they learn and sing about Jesus, hear Bible stories, do Bible skits, and much more. At the end of the 10 days, parents and families are invited to a special program to see what their children have learned. This introduction to the Gospel is the first step that leads families to signing up for the Year-Long Bible Club.

Year-Long Bible Club: This club is held after school and gives kids space to be kids. Children are introduced to recreational equipment, offered tutoring and homework help, experience discipleship, learn scripture, and taught basic life skills, health, and hygiene. These children often become evangelists that lead their families to Christ.

GOSPEL CENTERED EDUCATION AND FAMILY SERVICES TO REFUGEES

Born across the World. Escaped from Danger. Now your Neighbor.

For the Nations Refugee Outreach is a non-profit serving out of Dallas, Texas. Their ministry works with refugees who've migrated to the USA from war-torn countries in Africa, the Middle East, and Asia. These refugees have fled their country of origin due to war, natural disaster, or persecution based on their race, religion, ethnic group, social or political group, and countless other reasons that would make it dangerous to return. There are an estimated 32,500,000 refugees in the world, approximately 40,000 refugees have resettled in Texas since 2013. As refugees, they receive temporary personal help from the US government; however after a few months, government assistance ends, leaving many refugees without a way to communicate, acquire job skills, find employment, or learn life skills unique to American culture.

For the Nations, recognizing this need, made it their mission to provide educational and family services to refugees as they begin the process of adapting to new life in the United States. FTNRO has worked toward this mission by serving the refugee population holistically.

They provide immediate needs to refugees such as food and housing maintenance, but also aid in their sustainable needs by providing:

- English and citizenship classes
- Healthcare assistance
- Immigration legal services
- Life skills assistance
- Extended casework
- Play therapy
- Employment services

- Childcare for adult students
- Kids summer programs
- · Kids camp/club
- After school care programs
- Evangelistic sessions
- Bible studies
- And more!

Most importantly, For the Nations is dedicated to not only providing for the physical needs of refugees, but also ministers to their spiritual needs by weaving the Gospel message into all its programs.

Ministry Goals:

- Teach English & literacy to children and adults
- Teach life skills to children & adults
- Provide family services for refugees
- · Connect refugees with community
- Share the gospel with refugees
- Teach the Bible and the Christian faith to refugees









HOUSE CHURCH SUPPORT, DISCIPLESHIP IN CHINA, RESCUE & RELIEF, ADVOCACY, RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

ChinaAid was first founded in 2002 by Bob Fu, one of the leading voices in the world today for religious freedom in China. In 1996, Bob Fu and his wife, Heidi, were imprisoned for two months for "illegal evangelism" in Beijing. Once released, Bob and Heidi fled to the United States as religious refugees. It was from here they subsequently founded ChinaAid.

"ChinaAid is an international non-profit Christian human rights organization committed to promoting religious freedom and the rule of law in China." ChinaAid believes that religious freedom sets the foundation for all basic human rights. They seek to expose the abuse, encourage the abused, and equip leaders in defending their faith and freedom for all.

ChinaAid, along with their partners, assist the persecuted in China. How do they do this? By exposing, encouraging, and equipping.

Expose: ChinaAid writes and shares real testimonials in both English and Chinese so people across the world know the truth of what the CCP hopes to hide. They also have created an advocacy project that testifies in front of US policymakers and government officials.

Encourage: ChinaAid has created a Family of Prisoners fund that helps provide for the needs of families enduring abuse or who have had to make great sacrifices in the name of religious freedom and democracy.

Equip: ChinaAid provides theological and legal trainings for those in persecution. This gives people the spiritual strength and the legal knowledge to fight for their freedom.

ChinaAid hold four main initiatives:

- 1. Constituents The Freedom Circle a group of exclusive donors and partners who drive the mission of ChinaAid
- 2. Church Freedom to Pray the unification of Western Christians through prayer to support the global persecuted church
- 3.Culture Freedom to Be an online, social media freedom campaign to further push the message of religious freedom
- 4. Campus 4 the Freedom a peace and justice tour across college campuses to inspire and equip students to raise their voices and take action

CHURCH PLANTING, CANADA TO REACH THE LEAST-REACHED PEOPLE IN OUR OWN BACKYARD

Toronto Church Planting is a ministry focused on assisting Church Planters in creating healthy, reproducible, and transformational churches in Toronto.

Toronto is one of the most diverse cities in the world. Over 55% of the population is composed of visible minorities. In 2021, 46.6% of the population of Toronto was composed of immigrants with 9.6% identifying as Muslim, 6.2% as Hindu, 3.6% as Jewish, 2.3% as Buddhist, 0.8% as Sikh, and 30.6% having no religious affiliation at all. Between 2001 and 2021 the percentage of people who identified as Christian had decreased from 60.3% to 46.2% ("2021 Census Backgrounder on Citizenship Immigration Ethnicity Race ..." Toronto.Ca, 4 Nov. 2022.).

With such a diverse population, each group holding their own belief systems, the pursuit of Truth can feel overwhelming. For new or small church plants, serving this diversity while also managing the administrative demands of a growing church can quickly become a daunting task. In response, Toronto Church Planting has set out to partner with church planters and church plants to strengthen their church body, spread Truth, and transform the culture of Toronto with the Gospel.

They achieve this by inviting church planters to partner with them for a season in which they are free to vision cast, build/strengthen their church, evangelize to their community, and raise up a new generation of leaders. This season of support provides church planters and churches a time to focus solely on God's call on their lives and ministry while TCP oversees the corporate, administrative, and financial details of the church. In doing this, TCP hopes that church planters can focus more on engaging with their community, sharing the gospel, discipling new believers, and raising up leaders – ultimately resulting in a much healthier and sustainable church.

"When planting a church, there are a lot of details along the way. One crucial detail that you may have not considered is how to handle finances properly (bookkeeping, payroll, what you can and can't do with tithes, etc.). Not only is there a lot to know, but it requires a lot of time to manage. Toronto Church Planting has lifted this burden from us! They have been a blessing and excellent support, keeping us safe with law requirements and giving us more opportunities to invest our time in and keep our focus on the main thing; preaching the gospel and reaching out to those who don't know JESUS."

Naturally, when approached by China Aid, Stonegate saw this as an opportunity to bring the tools and experience learned from years of serving with FTNRO to our own community. Upon arriving in the US, the need for learning English as a second language became vital for Mayflower Church. ESL classes soon began at Stonegate in partnership with other local churches and servant leaders across Midland/Odessa.

God is bringing the nations to us and it is our responsibility as Christ-followers to respond. ESL Classes are only the beginning to sharing the Gospel with our new neighbors. The need and recognition for English as a second language has only grown with the influx of immigrants, refugees, and international students in the Permian Basin.

Free morning and evening ESL Classes are currently available at Stonegate during the spring and fall semesters. Learn more by visiting stonegatefellowship.com/missions/.










DRS. TREVOR AND REBECA BELL LUCI, PENNY, AND TEDDY



GUINEA, WEST AFRICA

Drs. Trevor and Rebeca Bell, along with their three children, serve as primary care doctors and medical missionaries among the Maninka frontier people in Guinea, West Africa. Guinea, situated along the Atlantic just southwest of the great Sahara Desert, is a predominantly Muslim country with interwoven traditional African beliefs. Despite their inherited beliefs, many of the people in Guinea are open to hearing the Gospel.

The Bells work primarily with unreached people groups with Animistic and Muslim backgrounds throughout the city of KanKan. By using various aspects of community health, they seek to work with the local church to open doors for gospel sharing. Their medical ministry consists of primary care visits on their property, weekly village visits for health teachings and Bible storying, home and hospital visits, hosting short-term teams, and more.

The current healthcare system in Guinea is crippled by low resources, poor infrastructure, and undertrained medical leaders. Many throughout the healthcare system have adopted a fatalist mindset and approach to care, resulting in lost trust among the people. Locals often choose to not seek medical care, and in some cases even seek help from dangerous alternatives (like fracture care from a welder).

Drs. Trevor and Rebeca Bell hope to rebuild trust, integrity, and faith to the local medical system. Their goal is to share the love of Christ through compassionate care, and share the truth of the gospel with those who need to hear.

SPAIN, WEST AFRICA, AND MENA

Diego and Gladys Campelo, along with their three children, serve the Argentine Baptist Convention in Guinea-Bissau, Senegal, Portugal, Puerto Rico, and Spain. Sent through Vision800, the Campelos assist Muslim refugees and unreached people groups seeking to enter Europe through Spain.

In 1995, Gladys and Diego met at the International Theological Seminary. Soon after, they got married and began cross-cultural training together at the Center for Cross-Cultural Missionary Training. In 1998, they began their first cross-cultural mission experience. After five years of intense service, they returned to their home country to train new mission workers and church planters. In 2017, God called the Campelo family to Spain to engage in the integral care of missionaries, church planters/planting, mobilization of the local church, and to work among the growing Muslim refugee population.

Sent by Vision800 Global, the Campelos serve a culture center called Centro Luz. Diego serves as the center's Spanish teacher and Chaplain, while Gladys serves as the Center Coordinator. As a family, they also serve as care workers to the center members. Centro Luz holds language classes, worship services, local outreach projects, evangelism, and more.







Dodds

TYLER AND BAILEY DODDS AUBREY AND NORAH



WORLDWIDE



Tyler and Bailey Dodds, along with their daughters — Aubrey and Norah — serve with Barnabas International, an international pastoral care ministry focused on shepherding global workers and training global shepherds.

As missionaries dedicate their lives to sharing the gospel, caring for the broken, and pouring into the lost, they often run the risk of spiritual burnout. The Dodds, as part of Barnabas International, serve to pour back into these global servants by offering retreats and conferences, trainings, counseling, debriefing, and more.

The Dodds use their musical and song writing giftings to lead people in worship and provide soul care during Barnabas Conferences.


The Dodds also provide care for missionaries and their families via Casa del Sol, a Texas guest house run by the Dodds to serve as a resting place for stateside missionaries.

Since 2015, Mike has led His Voice Global's Arise Discipleship Center and coordinated ministries for reaching unreached people groups and indigenous people groups across West Africa. In partnership with His Voice Global's four programs, the Elkins assist with student education, discipleship, Scripture reading, and food and physical therapy assistance for those with disabilities. For the last few years, Mike has served as HVG's co-National Director, while Megan has served as co-National Director and the Circle of Care Coordinator.

His Voice Global focuses its work in caring for the physical, educational, and spiritual needs of indigenous people groups in Uganda, South Sudan, and Kenya. His Voice Global, along with the Elkins, raise leaders among the vulnerable through four key programs: Thrive (education), Arise (discipleship center), Alive (outreach), and Shine (care).

EAST AFRICA/ETHIOPIA, DUBAI, AND USA

Getaneh Getaneh and his wife, Wosene Bahiru, serve as the founders of Watch and Pray International Ministries in Midland, Texas. Getaneh is originally from Ethiopia, but was forced to flee after suffering great persecution from the Mengistu regime. After his escape, he fled to Djibouti until it was safe to return to Ethiopia.

Today, Getaneh and Wosene live in Midland, Texas, and work to support evangelists and plant churches in Ethiopia. Through education, encouragement, pastor trainings, and corporate prayer, the Getanehs fight to bring Jesus to the persecuted, homeless, orphans, and widows.

TIM AND TAWNYA GREEN



USA AND EGYPT

Tim and Tawnya Green started as global workers in Fiji in partnership with Tying Vines Inc., a Christian nonprofit that connects global servants with indigenous leaders. Together, they focused on sharing the Gospel in afterschool programs, taught English to underprivileged children, as well as trained the next generation of believers to lead kids' programming.

In 2024, Tim and Tawnya left Fiji after 8 years of service and were presented with two new ministry opportunities. Both opportunities would allow them to use their experience from serving in Fiji to support and develop new churches and local leaders.

Today, the Greens are working in the DFW area in partnership with City Life Church for the development of a new children's ministry. In this season, the Greens are also transitioning toward serving Sudanese refugees in Egypt. This opportunity entails building up underserved refugee schools, training new and current teachers, creating and implementing curriculum, assisting the local church in evangelism, mobilizing the local church to unreached areas of North Africa, and more.









Cristian, a native to Romania, and his wife Michelle, along with their children — Myles, Kyler, Aralyn, and Elyana — serve with the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism (ABWE) in Romania. As a teenager, Cristian was burdened by the lack of evangelical presence among the 8,000 families in his village. In response, he went on to establish a church planting ministry at only 16 years old. Today, the Harleas continue reaching villages and families across Romania through discipleship, indigenous leadership training, pastor development, and church planting.

In the face of ongoing spiritual opposition — from government officials to non-evangelical sects — the Harleas remain steadfast in their mission to plant cross-cultural, reproducible churches where local leaders are discipled, equipped, and sent to train the next generation of leaders and church planters. To accomplish this, the Harleas engage through evangelism (such as VBS and outreach events), mobilization (leading discipleship groups, developing curriculum, meeting tangible community needs, and serving the local church), and discipleship (providing training, counseling, and meaningful relationships founded on Scripture).

BILL AND JULIE JOHNSON



NORTH AMERICA/FIRST NATIONS AND WEST AFRICA

Bill and Julie Johnson serve with Harvesters Ministries, a once small family ministry that has grown into a global church planting movement. Harvesters Ministries' mission is to "Plant one million churches, train one million pastors and evangelize and disciple one hundred million people".[1]

In partnership with Harvesters, Bill and Julie focus their ministry efforts on reaching First Nations by sharing the Gospel and love of Jesus with Native Americans. The Johnsons also help train new disciples, disciple-makers, and indigenous leaders across unreached people groups. Additionally, they work to support and build up new churches in West Africa.

JONATHAN AND KRISTEN LAZARINI NAYELI, ADELINE, JOAQUIN, JUSTUS, AND HONEY



NORTHERN THAILAND

Dr. Jonathan (Laz) and Kristen Lazarini, with their children — Nayeli, Adeline, Joaquin, Justus, and Honey — serve as medical missionaries in Northern Thailand. Previously located in Myanmar, the Lazarinis were forced to leave after war broke out. In 2024, they were presented the opportunity to move to Thailand to work with Thai locals and Burmese refugees along the border. In Myanmar, the Lazarinis ran a small medical clinic that offered ultrasound services and OBGYN care. They've cared for hundreds of patients, delivered countless babies, and trained up locals in the medical field at their clinic, all while sharing the Gospel and Jesus Christ as Savior to a predominately Buddhist community.

Now in Chiangrai, Thailand, the Lazarinis continue providing medical care through a clinic along the border of Thailand and Myanmar. Jonathan (Laz) also teaches medical ministry at the local medical school in Chiangrai, Thailand.

Youth with a Mission is a global mission-sending organization that trains youth and young adults for worldwide missions. They have bases in 190 countries that focus on mercy ministry, evangelism, and leadership training. Through YWAM, the Mansours help lead a community of 150 missionaries at a discipleship and missionary training base in Harpenden, England. Each year, they host hundreds of young adults for mission training — equipping them to serve on the field or live out their faith in their respective places of influence back home. In addition, John helps teach others on Worldview, God's Heart for Business, and Leadership, while Sharon oversees community outreach that supports marginalized groups throughout their community.

For the last 20 years, the Mansours have invested their time and resources into communities across East Africa, combining their ministry experience with business expertise to empower others.




BRUNO AND SUELLEN SIQUEIRA PEDRO AND LEVI

Cheyenne and Priscila Solis, with their three girls — Savannah, Lian, and Katie — serve in Bangkok, Thailand, with the Community Center Ministry Project through the International Mission Board.

Throughout Central Thailand, children don't often have safe places to go outside of school. In response, the IMB gathered a team to partner with local churches and believers to enter these neglected communities to build relationships, share the Gospel, start discipleship groups, and even plant new churches. Through the Community Center, the Solises focus on evangelism and discipleship by hosting kids' camps, free after-school tutoring, English classes, art and music classes, parenting courses, and Bible studies to meet the spiritual needs of families.

Extensions of the Community Center include the ELM Pregnancy Support Ministry, a help center for young and expecting mothers, and the Evangelism Project, which aims to reach the eight unreached provinces in Central Plains Thailand.

While in Thailand, Cheyenne also serves as the Global Mobilization Director for Stonegate Partner, Movilización Hispania. His role with Movilización Hispania is to help North American Hispanic Churches equip and send believers to work among unreached people groups throughout Southeast Asia.

KUALA LUMPAR, MALAYSIA

Berney and Kari Tower, with their four children — Kai, Brooks, Kasen, and Isla — currently serve the over 9 million people of Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The Towers primarily work to see unreached Muslim people groups transformed by the Gospel and start multiplying churches across urban cities and beyond. This involves broad evangelism, discipleship of new believers, and church planting. Additionally, the Towers invest in discipling locals of other people groups who are legally permitted to follow Jesus - unlike their target unreached people group - to see them fulfill the Great Commission.

With its strategic location between the Kelang and Gombak rivers, Kuala Lumpar has vastly grown over the decades to become a vital cultural, commercial, and transportation hub in Malaysia. With these systems bringing in new people every day, the need for the Gospel has only grown with it.

The Towers serve to bring the Gospel and Truth to unreached Muslims in Malaysia through evangelism, discipleship, and church planting, while also mobilizing new missionaries from diverse backgrounds to reach the unreached.







TOM AND ROBIN WILSON



WORLDWIDE

Since 2020, Tom and Robin Wilson have served as missionaries to help mobilize the Body of Christ to reach the most unreached and spiritually darkest nations with the good news of the Gospel. Through their sending agency, Tom helps churches and individuals identify their role in the Great Commission and invites them to join God as He builds His Kingdom. Tom shared that they do this by "multiplying followers of Jesus in the spiritually darkest places." Tom serves in many capacities including: leading and participating in short term mission teams, working with indigenous partners, modeling and training indigenous leaders locally and abroad, helping led apprentices through prayer practices, and having Gospel conversations. Tom is especially drawn to contextualizing the gospel for different cultures.

Robin is referred to as the "domestic engineer" as she serves alongside Tom locally and abroad. She has served her family and community by homeschooling, serving on church worship teams, ministering to the homeless, participating in short term missions, working with UPGs, and even founding a blessings business.

- · Working to launch church planting movements around the world




