Sid and Wendy Harper; Grafted Together (USA and East Africa): Sid has made great progress in his Arabic studies, spending long hours diving into lessons and practicing every chance he gets. In the coming months, Sid hopes to travel to Jordan to continue his studies in person for a few weeks. Through these lessons, Sid has been able to connect with a specific community of Arabic speakers in College Station with the gospel. The Harpers ask for continued prayers for Sid's learning and for God to use these new skills to connect with more Arabic speaking people in their community.

A few weeks ago, Sid and Wendy also welcomed their 4th grandbaby, Dalani Maleigh, whose already captured their hearts.

Oleksii and Ivanna Ivanov (Hrubieszów, Poland): The Ivanov family continues faithfully serving in Hrubieszów, Poland, where they are actively sharing the Gospel through church ministry, discipleship, outreach events, and relational evangelism. Together with their growing ministry team, they continue hosting home group gatherings and church events designed to build relationships and create opportunities to share Christ with their community. Through picnics, café ministry, Bible discussions, and personal conversations, they are seeing more doors open to minister to Polish and Ukrainian residents, struggling families, students, and those facing loneliness, depression, or hardship.

Ivanna and the children remain deeply involved in ministry through worship, evangelism, art classes, and outreach opportunities at schools for children with special needs and local orphanages. One recent highlight included an Easter concert where over one hundred students, teachers, and parents heard the message of Christ's resurrection. Ivanna also hosted gatherings for Ukrainian refugees using practical activities like baking traditional Ukrainian buns to foster relationships and share the meaning of Easter and the hope of the Gospel.

The Ivanovs continue to walk closely alongside many individuals, including families facing disability and illness, young women searching for hope, elderly men open to spiritual conversations, and youth exploring faith in Christ. They shared encouragement over Patricia, a young woman from the church youth group who recently prayed to trust in Jesus, as well as excitement for the upcoming wedding of two disciples, Yakub and Natalia.

As they continue serving, the Ivanovs ask for prayer for ongoing evangelism opportunities, wisdom in ministry, their children's schooling and exams, resolution of important family documentation issues, and provision for a vehicle needed to support their ministry efforts. Above all, they remain grateful for the partnership, prayers, and support that allow them to continue proclaiming the Gospel and building God's kingdom in Poland.
