Berney and Kari Tower with Kai, Brooks, Kasen, and Isla (Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia): Over the past 6-weeks, Kari and Berney led an evangelism course at their local church, training over 25 individuals on how to share Jesus with others from all faith backgrounds. Their expectations have been exceeded through this training, as many attendees have already shared stories of gospel conversations with strangers and leading people to salvation. One woman shared how she was able to lead her father to Christ shortly before he passed away. Two pastors who attended the course also shared that it reshaped their understanding of evangelism, inspiring them to organize a street outreach night. More than 24 people joined the outreach, engaging their community through prayer, compassion, and sharing the Good News. Berney noted that just a few years ago, this level of local participation would have seemed impossible. Looking ahead, Kari and Berney will be focusing on preparing course material for local churches to continue the evangelism training independently, while also preparing their family to visit the States this spring.

Al and Ginger Yowell (Frankfurt, Germany): The new year in Frankfurt began unusually snowy for Al and Ginger. They shared that they've received more snow in the past month than in all their previous years in Germany. As a result, the Yowells found themselves homebound and unable to travel as planned. Despite this, they were grateful for the opportunity to spend the holidays with their German neighbors—strengthening community relationships and experiencing new holiday traditions within a local German household. Reflecting on the past year, the Yowells shared that their church has seen an abundance of answered prayers and celebrated the distribution of more than 1,500 gospel booklets. Looking ahead, Al and Ginger will be traveling to Spain to help facilitate the first PATH event of Greater Europe Mission. This gathering is designed to support global workers in various seasons of ministry transition by providing pastoral care and courses focused on identity.
