

ANCHORED | JESUS. MAN, GOD, OR BOTH?

Lesson 3: Like Father, Like Son



Dear Parents,

Hello! I wanted to remind you about the study we're doing that focuses on helping students remain steady in the face of adversity and encourage them to grow deeper in their relationship with God. This Bible study is called *Anchored: Sure and Steadfast*, and this week is the last of a three-lesson unit called *Jesus: Man, God, or Both?* In this lesson, we are highlighting the Divinity of Jesus. Students should understand that Jesus didn't earn His divinity by being good or having partial divinity. Jesus is fully God, particularly God the Son.

LESSON OVERVIEW: Being in a relationship with Jesus requires knowing Him. And knowing Him means knowing that He is fully God. In this lesson, we will look at Jesus's answer to a question asked by His disciples, a question that we still think about today.

WHAT WE WANT YOUR STUDENT TO LEARN: That knowing Jesus means believing that He is fully God.

WHAT WE WANT YOUR STUDENT TO DO WITH WHAT THEY'VE LEARNED: Identify Jesus's claims of divinity, understand how Jesus displays divinity clearly in Scripture, and seek out ways to share that with others.

SCRIPTURE PASSAGES WE STUDIED: John 14:8-11, Matthew 1:18-25, Matthew 14:22-23, John 8:12-20, 1 John 5:10-12.

Next Steps. . .

During the next week, as you engage in conversations with your student, remember that one way that will help them to understand and apply what they have learned is to explain it to someone else. Use the following questions to guide your conversation:

- What was your Anchor Statement for this week? (Answer: I believe Jesus is fully God (while also being fully human))
- Are there any questions that you have about Jesus's divinity after this week's lesson? Let's write them down and find the answers together!
- How does knowing that Jesus's name, Immanuel, means God With Us impact the way you think about Him?
