The Resurrection of Jesus & God's Good Future 1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-58 ROMANS 8:18-25 REVELATION 21:1-5

As Christians, we believe that Jesus was crucified and then raised to life in a glorious "spiritual" or "heavenly" body. This event happened in real time in the middle of human history, and we believe that it changed everything. But how? And what does it mean for us in the present and for where things are going in the future? In the second message of our series, Pastor David invites us to consider the significance of the resurrection and how it reveals what God plans to do with all of creation.

### The Last Things current series

Eschatology is the study of "the last things" in Christian theology. The eschaton is about the biblical view of the future, which comes into sharp focus with Jesus and the New Testament. Where is everything going? What happens when we die? And what about heaven, hell, the end times, the second coming, the final judgment, and the resurrection? In this 7-week sermon series, we will explore *The Last Things* and how our knowledge of the future can deepen our trust in God in times of fear and uncertainty, ground us in the Christian hope, and help us to live in light of the last things.

## **Krista Reitnour**

I grew up in a fearful home environment. My dad struggled with alcohol and a bad temper. I never knew whether he was going to act out of love or out of anger. In 9<sup>th</sup> grade, I experienced a devasting knee injury that ended my gymnastics career and revealed that my identity had been placed in being a high-level gymnast. I grieved the loss of my gymnastics career and grappled with my sense of worth. It was during this difficult time that God began to show Himself to me as the Perfect, Faithful Father who had chosen me as His daughter. His love was not based on anything I did, but

instead, was based on what He had done for me on the Cross. Unlike my earthly father, God was and would always be completely loving and faithful to me. Although I had previously prayed to ask "Jesus into my heart" around the age of six, it was during this difficult time in high school that I came to understand the depth of God's love for me to a greater extent, and I demonstrated my commitment to following Jesus by being baptized. As I reflect on my life with Christ over the years, the hymn, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" comes to mind. It was the night before Easter Sunday. I heard several times, "go and convert." Honestly, I didn't know what that meant. Because it was Easter Sunday I went to a Christian church nearby. I didn't know anyone there. They started praying over people. I remember an elderly lady with long grey hair asked me if they could pray for me. I was prayed over. I fell to the ground, they continued praying. I felt this heat all over my body. That day God healed me from addiction. I no longer had desire for it. Right there I gave my heart to Jesus. Walked out of church a different person. I was then baptized in 1995. That was my life before God saved me from that dark space I was in. Thank you, Jesus! I moved to Pennsylvania, God led me to House of Worship in York, PA. I was a member. The pastor sold the building and moved to Florida. After that I had been in and out of churches. Now, here I am at Grantham, where I feel the love of God and have a family in Christ. I'm so grateful and honored to have Jesus in my life. He's my Lord and Savior.



# Ada Rhoads

As I look back over my life, I recognize how God has brought me through many challenges (illnesses, surgeries, etc.), and also he has blessed me in many ways. Special blessings are my family. Over the years I have been part of and active in many denominations. I was baptized as an infant. My mother took us to church and Sunday School and encouraged Bible study. It took me a long time to think of God as a good

and loving Father, because my earthly father was not patient and was sometimes harsh and demanding.

When it became apparent to me that my current church denomination was straying away from Biblical teaching, I felt compelled to seek a Jesus-loving, Bible-teaching church. This search led me to Grantham BIC, where I feel as if God wants me to be part of the congregation, including being baptized as an adult, and continue to grow and become more like Jesus in thought, word, and deeds.

In February 2020 I was diagnosed with Lyme disease and struggled with Lyme-induced anxiety, on top of pandemic-induced anxiety, and my battle with depression returned. After extensive treatments, Lyme was eradicated in October 2020, and I felt healthy enough to start growing our family in 2022. After experiencing two miscarriages, a myomectomy in June 2023, and months of healing and testing, in November 2023 we found out I was pregnant again. Logan was born on July 1, 2024, and is our sweetest miracle and constant reminder of God's faithfulness.

Through the latter part of my life I have learned over and over of the goodness of God, and that sometimes you have to endure the roughest storms to get to the point where God has called you to be. The people from Grantham church helped us through our storm and that's why we are pursuing membership. We are thankful for our church family.

## **Derek Boyce**

I first became a Christian when my childhood Sunday school teacher taught that if we wanted to go to heaven we needed to ask Jesus into our hearts. Like many others in my class who raised their hands that day, I continued to do everything I had done before, but with what I thought to be an automatic track to heaven. One evening in November 1995, my life would change forever. I was taken to the emergency room because of a severe asthma attack, unable to breathe with blue lips, barely conscious, and a

deathly low blood oxygen level. The next thing I remember was the brightest of lights and the most soothing, caring voice telling me, "I don't know you. It is not time for you to be here."
