ekklēsia – "called out" ones

- Is used 114 times in the New Testament
- In the Greco-Roman world it was a formal assembly in a religio-political context that made decisions for the city
- In the LXX & NT: the assembly or gathering of God's people; the Lord's chosen vessel for embodying his gospel mission

Paul, Ephesians 3:10-11 (VOICE)



Portrait of an Early House Church in Rome

- Met in larger house (a dozen or so people 30 max)
- Men and women
- Roman citizens and non-citizens
- Single, married, divorced, and widows
- Jews and Gentiles (different political, religious and moral backgrounds views ranging from strange to offensive)
- Various ethnicities with different customs and traditions
- Freed slaves and slaves who had no legal rights
- Folks from elite classes down to the poor and the homeless



Getting the church right is so important. The church is God's world-changing social experiment of bringing unlikes and differences to the table to share life with one another as a new kind of family. When this happens, we show the world what love, justice, peace, reconciliation, and life together are designed by God to be. 

Important points from this passage and others in the NT:

- 1. We are baptized by one Spirit to form one body (church).
- 2. Like the parts of our body, we're all different, but we need each other to know Christ, grow as disciples, and be on mission.
- 3. We're all functioning together, not being idle.
- 4. Everything we say and do ought to come from love (1 Cor. 13).
- 5. We're committed and covenanted to one another.

The space of this common was where life stories, life projects, plans, and purposes were being intercepted by a new orientation. This common is created by the Spirit. How could the things they held dear not be drawn toward the common, this new gathering, this ekklesia? Time, talent, and treasures, the trinity of possessions we know so well, would feel the pull of this holy vortex." (Jennings, Acts, pg.39)
