






Get some stuff.



Big Question 1 WHERE DO I START?

Before a trip, you might have some questions: Where are we going? What snacks are we taking? When is the next bathroom stop?! When you make a choice to follow Jesus, you might have some questions, too. That's good!

Pray. Talk with God about your questions. Ask Him to guide your adventure.

To start answering your awesome questions, let's go back. Way back. Before there was anything else, there was God. He's existed forever.

God made the entire universe, the world, and everything in it. Of all His creations, He loved us humans the most! In fact, He gave us a really big job. We get to enjoy and take care of what He made.

But something bad happened. Sadly, humans chose to sin.



What is sin?

Sin is a choice that shows we trust ourselves more than we trust God and His good plan. Sin hurts us, others, and the world. Since God is perfect and sin is not, sin separates us from Him.

What did Good do about sin?

God sent His Son, Jesus, to Earth. Jesus was born as a 100% human baby who was also 100% God. Jesus lived just like us in every way—except He never sinned. He showed us how to love God and love others. He chose to die on a cross to fix our friendship with God. He took the punishment for every single person's sins.






Why would Jesus do something like that?

Let's read what Jesus said:

"For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him." John 3:16-17 NLT

Jesus told us God's plan. God loves us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to save us from sin by dying on a cross.







The good news is God's power brought Jesus back to life. Now Jesus lives FOREVER! You can choose to follow Jesus, ask Him to forgive your sin, and become part of God's family.

God loves you. He wants a close relationship with you. This good news makes people want to follow Jesus their whole lives!

I ate the worst cookie ever.

I was at my grandma's house. She made warm chocolate chip cookies. I swiped a few and took a bite. Something was off. Waaaaay off. I spit out the awful cookie bite!

My sweet grandma was hurt. Until she tried one. She let out a long, loud, "EWWWWWWWW""

We uncovered the horrible truth. She forgot the sugar. The cookies tasted like postage stamps. Even the chocolate chips couldn't save them.

Grandma missed a very important step.

When starting your adventure of following Jesus, there's one very important step you don't want to miss.

What is the step I don't want to miss?

Ask yourself, "Is this an adventure I want to take?"

The Bible tells us this:

If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by openly declaring your faith that you are saved. Romans 10:9-10 NLT



We can choose to say, "Jesus, you are the King of my life. Not me. I want You in charge."

What do I do if I want to make that choice?


We've got you. Pray and let God know you want to follow Jesus.



/Does life feel different after I choose to follow Jesus?

Following Jesus is more than a feeling. Feelings come and go. Jesus never changes.

Think about it this way: How do you teach someone to play your favorite board game?

You don't tell them how they should feel when they play. Instead, you break it into how, what, and who:

The how: Rules

With what: Tokens, cards, and boards

The who: The players

In the same way, a man asked Jesus to describe the best way to live life. Jesus didn't tell the man how to feel. Instead, He broke it into how, what, and who:

Jesus replied, "'You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" Matthew 22:37-39 NLT

The how: Love

With what: Your whole self—heart, soul, and mind

The who: God and all the people He created To follow Jesus, it takes everything you've got.

So, what DO we know about God?

First off, God is pretty mysterious. One great mystery of God is the Trinity—God is three beings—but also only one being. What?!?



Here's what that means: God shows Himself as the Father, the Son (that's Jesus!), and the Holy Spirit. All three are equals in power and exist forever as "three in one."







- God is big. (Isaiah 66:1-2) He's so super-sized, we describe Him with big words like omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent. Those are fancy ways to say God can do anything, knows everything, and is always with everyone.
- God is love. (1 John 4:16) God's love is unconditional, unstoppable, and unchanging. You don't earn His love by doing more, and you don't lose His love when you mess up. God's love is patient and kind.
- God is with you. (John 14:15-16) Jesus is a good friend. He gives you a gift, the Holy Spirit—a powerful Helper who is always with you. When you choose to follow Jesus, you have a personal relationship with God. You can know Him like you know a friend.



Can I see God?

Check out what the Bible tells us.

No one has ever seen God. But the unique One, who is himself God, is near to the Father's heart. He has revealed God to us. John 1:18 NLT



Jesus shows us what God is like. Look at Jesus. Follow Him. You can know God's power, love, and friendship.

Big Question 4

Baptism might look fun, like swimming! Baptism might look strange, like you're in a pool with too many people watching.

Maybe you want to do it. Or maybe you're afraid water would go up your nose.

Baptism might seem weird—but it's a meaningful tradition.





What is baptism, exactly?


Baptism is when a pastor or trusted person helps you dip under water and come right back up. It's your next step when you decide to make Jesus the leader of your life.

Now is the time to let everyone know Jesus changed your life!





Jesus chose to be baptized, too. One of Jesus' friends wrote about it:





But why go under water?

Baptism is a symbol. It shows Jesus died, came back to life, and that you have new life in Him.

Going under the water shows your sins are washed away because of Jesus' death.

Rising out of the water shows you have new life because Jesus was raised back to life.

Why do people want to see me get baptized?

Baptism is a way to show that Jesus has changed your life forever, and that's something people want to celebrate. It's kinda like a PARTY!



They're around here somewhere.





If someone said dogs didn't have tongues, you'd let your dog lick all over their face.

If they said breakfast didn't exist, you'd make some waffles. Or toss them a jelly donut.



If they claimed gymnastics weren't real, you'd cartwheel and backflip all over the place!

It's easy to believe in those things because we can feel and eat and see them.

So how do we know Good is real if we've never seen Him?

There are things we believe in that we can't see. Oxygen. Gravity. The love you have for your family. But you can see and feel the effects of those things.



Make a list of invisible things that are really, really real.

You can't physically see or feel God, but you can see and feel the effects of His realness and love. When you choose to believe in Jesus, you choose to believe He's real and He's here.

That's faith.

It's not silly or childish to believe God is real. He's not a fairy tale. There's historical proof of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. There is logical evidence.

The big story of the Bible shows God's faithful love for people—even when people reject Him.

If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny who he is. 2 Timothy 2:13 NLT

God is always faithful and trustworthy—you can count on that.



If I said God wasn't real, what would you show me? Where would you take me? Talk about it.



Maybe you'd show Bible verses, share historical evidence, or tell personal stories of how you've seen God show up in your life.

One of Jesus' closest friends, Peter, wrote this in the Bible:

Instead, you must worship Christ as Lord of your life. And if someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it. But do this in a gentle and respectful way. ... 1 Peter 3:15-16 NLT

What if you showed how real God is by how you follow Jesus? What if everyone knew you had hope in Jesus by the way you loved them?







Big Question 6

HOW DO I BECOME MORE LIKE JESUS?

You made it halfway through this book! Do a happy dance!

Now back to the adventure. A lot of people who follow Jesus ask this important question:

I want to be more like Jesus. How do I do that?

You learn from Jesus!

It's like becoming a concert violinist, pro soccer player, or expert chef. Before you become a master, you learn from a master.

Jesus is our master. We are His disciples. (Disciple is a word that means "learner.")

How do I learn from Jesus?

To learn from Jesus, spend time with Jesus.

The next few pages have more on how to do that.

But let's start here. Spend time with Jesus by reading His words in the Bible:

... "'You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments." Matthew 22:37-40 NLT



Love God and love your neighbor.

You might remember that because you read it on page 12. You already learned from Jesus' words in the Bible!



How do I know I'm doing a good job?

Living like Jesus means you're getting better at loving God and loving others.

Loving God and loving others is like a habit. The Holy Spirit gives you the power to love like Jesus right away. But it still takes a lot of time and a lot of practice for it to come naturally.

What if I mess up?

Don't give up! Remember, you're a learner. And learning is a lifelong journey.

Learners get knowledge, practice skills, and defeat setbacks. Learners also make mistakes, fall short, and keep moving forward.

Everyone does things they know they shouldn't. You don't need to run or hide from God. He is kind and ready to forgive you the moment you ask.

Talk with God. If you're not sure what to say, here's a prayer to help:





God, what I did was wrong. Thank You for helping me see that. Please help me get back on track, live like Jesus, and grow in love. In Jesus' name, amen.



Big Question 7

WHAT ARE WAYS TO GET CLOSER TO GOD?





My best friend had the coolest backyard—treehouse, bike trails, rope swings, and trampoline included.

We loved hanging out there. We talked about our favorite videos, made up jokes, and shared a lot of laughs.

Jumping on trampolines, talking, and telling jokes can make you feel closer to your best friend. But lots of people wonder how to feel closer to God.

How can I feel closer to God?

To feel closer to God, get to know Him. There are lots of different ways to do that!





Look at something small and talk about what you see. Next, turn the object to look at it in a different way. Talk about anything new you see.

How was it helpful to look at the object in different ways?

It's helpful to get to know God in different ways. Here are some ideas!

Talk with God.

Talking with God is called prayer. God always listens. Share your stories (even silly ones), thoughts, and needs with Him. Prayer can be as simple as filling in these blanks:

Prayer is sitting silently with God. Prayer is crying or laughing with Him. You don't have to worry about saying the "wrong" thing. Just be honest. If it matters to you, share it with God.

Writing what's in your heart is another way to pray. Go to pages 36-39 and doodle a prayer.



Learn from the Bible.

The Bible tells us who God is and how people like us can get to know Him. It's full of ways to grow closer to God. Here are a few:



- Believe in God. (Hebrews 11:6)
- Love others. (1 John 4:7)
- Come close to God. (James 4:8)
- 🕮 Obey God. (1 John 2:3)





Meet with other Jesus followers.



The Bible also tells us that getting closer to God is better with friends:

Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together ... Hebrews 10:24-25 NLT

Meeting together at church is a fantastic way to follow Jesus with friends. (More about that on pages 28-29.)



Church is a **place**—a place to hang out, serve, learn from the Bible, and sing songs about God's love with others!



Church is a **family**—the family of God. Everywhere you go, you are the church. You can invite others to grow closer to God with you.

Big Question 8 WHAT IS THE BIBLE?

The Bible is a collection of 66 different books. It took more than 40 people and a thousand years to write! It's full of ancient poetry, songs, history, laws, and letters.

Today's Bibles have two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The New Testament was written after the life of Jesus.

The Bible tells one big story about who God is and how much He loves us: God invites us to be His children and guides us to live like Jesus.

How do I read the Bible?

Get one. It's hard to read a book you don't have.

Empty your piggy bank and buy one. Borrow one. Ask family if they have an extra you can read. Or download the Bible App to a phone or tablet if you have one.

Look for a Bible that makes sense to you.

There are lots of translations of the Bible. Look for ones that are easier to understand, like the NIV, NLT, or NIRV translations.

Think about how you learn best. Choose a Bible with pictures in it, one you can journal and color in, or press play on an audio Bible! The Bible App has many audio Bible options and offers a special font to make reading easier for people with dyslexia.

Where do I start reading the Bible?

If you're new to following Jesus, start by reading about His life. Flip to the New Testament. You'll find four books called Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

These four books tell you about Jesus: His story, His love, and His example.

What do I do when I read something confusing?

The Bible can be complicated and difficult to understand, and sometimes it's just plain weird. People who study it for their entire lives still have questions, and the Bible is actually written in a way to make you ask questions!

As you read, dig deeper by asking good questions like:

"Who wrote this?"

"How can this help me love God and love others?"

"Who are they talking to?"

"What is happening in these verses?"



Sometimes you'll find answers to your questions. Sometimes you won't. Either way, keep asking. Pray. Share what you're reading and the questions you have with people you trust.



A friend is always loyal, and a brother is born to help in time of need. Proverbs 17:17 NLT



They've all better with friends!

We don't just have friends with us on this adventure—we have God's family.

When the adventure gets tough, they pray for us and help us out. And when the adventure is awesome, they celebrate with us!



If you want to know more about how Jesus met new friends, read Matthew 4:18-23.

Where do I find friends?

You don't need all new friends just because you started following Jesus. Ask your old friends new questions. Ask if they know Jesus. Ask if they'd like to read the Bible with you or pray with you.

You might have an old friend right in front of you who's ready to follow Jesus with you. Maybe there's someone at your school, or a neighbor across the street, or a teammate!

Don't forget sisters, brothers, cousins, aunts, uncles, parents, grandparents ... family members can be great friends to follow Jesus with, too!

What do I say?

Don't you love talking about what you love? Spoiler alert-everyone does!

Rule #1 for making new friends (or loving on your old friends):

Listen more.

Talk less.



Ask things like:

"What always makes you laugh?"

"If you had wings, where would you fly?"

"Do you have any hidden talents?"

Friends aren't here just for you. Listen to your friends and they'll know you're there for them, too.


Who should I make friends with?


When someone likes what you like, that's great! Be friends. You can encourage each other to grow.

When someone disagrees with you, that's ALSO great! Be friends. You can challenge each other to grow.

Different types of friends help us grow! God created all of us to be in His family, but that doesn't mean everyone sees things the same way.

Different friends see things in different ways! Imagine two friends are looking at these blocks from different directions. Solution is on page 40.





People who follow Jesus disagree sometimes. But choosing *respect* helps us listen to each other, learn from each other, and, most importantly, love each other the way Jesus loves us.

What if I have zero friends who follow Jesus?

DON'T get rid of your friends.

If you have good friends who don't follow Jesus, keep having fun together and being there for one another. Share Jesus with them by continuing to be a good friend.



Jesus focused on loving others. He cared for them. He forgave them. He was generous.


And everywhere He went He told everyone about God's love.

Whenever you wonder what to do next, remember the choice you made at the beginning of this book.


