Noel: He is Born Where Did Jesus Come From?

1. In what ways have common misconceptions about the gospel message led to Christians not experiencing the abundant life that Jesus promises us, but rather exhaustion, judgmentalism or just apathy?

2. Read 1 John 4:7-9

What do we learn about God from this passage?

In what ways, if any, have you wrestled with not seeing God as defined by love? How have you struggled to see the Father as relatable as the Son?

3. How have you understood & related to the Trinity? Can you relate to sometimes having a stale, "believe this because you have to, but don't really know why it matters" view of the trinity?

How does seeing how incredibly relational and loving the trinity is before creation impact your understanding of God and His posture towards you?

4. Discuss the following quote from Dr. Baxter Kruger. Unpack a little bit what you think he means and discuss how it does or does not align to your scriptural understanding of the Trinity.

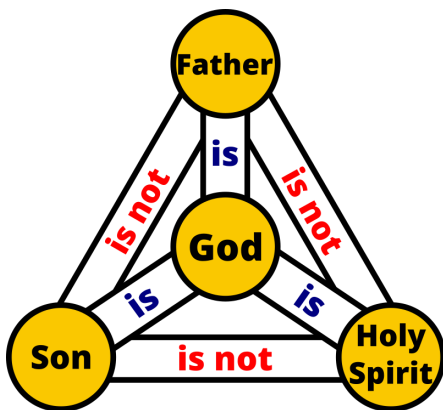

The TRINITY is the very essence of Who God is.

To be God is to be in fellowship, to be in relationship

1 John 4:7-8 (NIV)

*Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because **God is love.***

John 17:24 (NIV)

Father, I want these whom you have given me to be with me where I am. Then they can see all the glory you gave me because you loved me even before the creation of the world.

Matthew 3:17 (ESV)

This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

John 12:44-45, 49-50 (NLT)

Jesus shouted to the crowds, "If you trust me, you are trusting not only me, but also God who sent me. For when you see me, you are seeing the one who sent me... I don't speak on my own authority. The Father who sent me has commanded me what to say and how to say it. And I know his commands lead to eternal life; so I say whatever the Father tells me to say."

What we have, then, is a picture of God whose love, even in eternity past, even before the creation of anything, is other-oriented."

If God were unipersonal, (meaning not distinct/not relational) then he would have not known love until he created other beings. In that case, love and community would not have been essential to his character; it would have emerged later. But God is triune, and therefore love, friendship, and community are intrinsic to him and at the heart of all reality.

It is all about fellowship. And fellowship means that God is not a lonely, sad and depressed being. As Father, Son and Spirit, living in fellowship, God is essentially and eternally very happy. The Father, Son and Spirit live in conversation, in a fellowship of free-flowing togetherness and sharing and delight--a great dance of shared life that is full and rich and passionate, creative and good and beautiful.

Let us make human beings in our image, to be like us.

John 10:10 (ESV)

I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

So a triune God created us but he would not have created us to get the joy of mutual love and service, because he already had that. Rather, he created us to share in his love and service... to share the joy and love that God knew within himself

The ultimate reason that God creates, is not to remedy some lack in God, but to extend that perfect internal communication of the triune God's goodness and love.... God's joy and happiness and delight in divine perfections is expressed.

Now, why does this God, this Father, Son and Spirit, create the universe? Why does this Father, Son and Spirit create human beings, you, me, our children? Why does this Father, Son and Spirit create the animals and birds and fish and flowers, and the millions of beautiful things all around us? Why does this God create work and play and relationships, romance and sex, sports and laughter and food?

What is the rhyme and reason behind all of these things? When you start with the Trinity, it is the most obvious thing in the world.
