B.L.E.S.S. **Begin With Prayer**



- 1. Read Luke 11:1-13
 - Notice this begins with Jesus praying. His Disciple's hear Jesus praying and ask him to teach them to pray like He does. Summarize Jesus' message on prayer in these examples he gives.
- 2. Read Matthew 6:9-10, the first half of the extended version of the Lord's Prayer. What does it mean to pray for God Kingdom to come? What does it mean for His will to be done on Earth as it is in heaven? How do we actually pray for this today?
- 3. This week in the sermon James talked about how prayer changes us. How does prayer change us?

Share some examples of how you have been changed through your prayers for others.

- 4. Discuss how God works in others through our prayers. Share examples of how you have seen God do this.
- 5. Share about the one person you are actively seeking to BLESS who is not currently walking with Jesus.
- 6. Have each person pray for the person they have chosen.

Ephesians 1:3-5 (NLT)

All praise to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly realms because we are united with Christ. Even before he made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy and without fault in his eyes. God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to himself through Jesus Christ.

Luke 3:21-22 (NIV)

Romans 8:31-39 (NIV)

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 9:1-4 (NIV)

I speak the truth in Christ—I am not lying, my conscience confirms it through the Holy Spirit - I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my people, those of my own race, the people of Israel
