Discussion Questions January 12, 2025

Acts 16:6-10 Hearing God's Voice



- 1. Share a time when you felt a clear sense of God directing you and what that looked like.
- 2. Read acts 16:6-10
 How does the Holy Spirit Guide Paul and his companions in this passage?

Why might God have closed the doors to Asia & Bithynia?

The Holy Spirit didn't give Paul an immediate answer but allowed him to feel his way around the continent over many months. How does this challenge our expectations of how God speaks & directs?

- 3. In verse 10, the word conclude (symbibázō in the original Greek) means to draw a conclusion based upon the evidence. What does this look like for us today in combining reasoning & faith and divine direction?
- 4. The sermon mentioned various ways God communicates (e.g., Scripture, open and closed doors, godly desires, wise counsel, still small voice). Which of these has been most prominent in your life and give an example.
- 5. How can we guard against misinterpreting personal desires or circumstances as God's voice?
- 6. Discuss your comfort levels with seeking to hear God's voice as you pray for others? If appropriate, take some time and pray for one another in pairs or threes, asking God to lead you as your pray.



So instead, they went on through Mysia to the seaport of Troas.




Acts 16:9-10 (NLT)

Paul's process of hearing God in Acts 16

- Follow their Godly Desires
- Seek God's direction
- Without clarity, they do what they feel God has put upon their heart to do
- Recognize when God is closing doors
- Keep seeking God as they continue serving
- God gives them a vision
- Together conclude where to go next
