As far as times of transition go, at least for me and my family, this one has proven to be more than trying. And, despite all my best and most efficient efforts, our home closing here in Indiana is facing an unforeseen delay that might keep me from arriving in Peoria for a couple more weeks beyond when I had hoped.

It is disappointing when something doesn't go according to our plans, isn't it? Sometimes it feels hopeless to navigate this life. But often blessings simply come in the form of the good company of the Spirit in the midst of all the trials and tribulations of life.

In addition to all that comes with packing up our life and preparing to relocate, we also have faced the challenge of dealing with our daughter Emma's mental health crisis. She spent 9 days at an inpatient facility specializing in autistic children. She started on a program of medication, which has helped control her violent outbursts and severe mood swings, but she still requires a lot of managing.

I share about these challenges not only to help explain why I am unfortunately not there with you all quite yet, but also to seek your prayers. If you are a praying disciple of Jesus, one who calls on his name, one who has known the work of the Holy through prayer, your soon-to-be pastor needs your prayer support. Prayers that all outstanding issues will work out, that all matters of timing might be divinely orchestrated, that all will stay safe and well, and that our coming arrival will be a joyous one for all! We are so grateful for your prayers.

I believe deeply in a theological concept I call "for, not to". That life, even our challenges, happen for us and not to us - that God is calling us always towards blessing and making opportunities of every situation.

I am eager to be with you all, and as always will travel with the Spirit - for what other choice is there?

At The Blue Duck, they aim to deliver a familiar and approachable product in exciting and unexpected ways. In this




