Investing in Transformation

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church at Cenchreae... Greet Prisca and Aquila, my coworkers in Christ Jesus... Greet Andronicus and Junia... Greet one another with a holy kiss. Romans 16:1–16 (selected)

The early church didn't run on programs or polished systems. It ran on people: on Phoebe who carried Paul's letter, on Junia who preached when few believed she should, on Prisca and Aquila who opened their home when others closed their doors. The gospel spread not because it was efficient, but because it was embodied.

These names, often skimmed over, are the heartbeat of the movement. They remind us that the Church has always depended on the faithfulness of ordinary people who risked, gave, and showed up; people whose generosity turned belief into action and whose courage made space for others to belong.

We stand in their lineage. Every act of generosity, every risk for love, every gift that fuels ministry adds a new name to the story. This is what it means to be stewards of justice and transformation - not just to maintain a church, but to keep a movement alive.

We don't give to preserve the past; we give to empower what comes next. The legacy we build isn't made of bricks or budgets, but of lives changed and hope carried forward.
