Making Room...

...for What's New

Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth — do you not perceive it?
Isaiah 43:19

New beginnings almost never arrive quietly. They stir things up. They knock gently, or not so gently, at the doors of our comfort zones. Even when the change is good, it's still change. And that means letting go of something familiar.

Faith doesn't demand blind enthusiasm for what's next. It simply asks that we stay open; that we make room in our hearts, our habits, and our assumptions for what God might be unfolding. Making room for what's new means honoring what has been, without clinging to it so tightly that we miss the beauty of what's becoming.

It's not about forgetting the past. It's about creating space for the Spirit to shape the future.

This kind of openness takes courage. It takes trust. And sometimes, it just takes a deep breath and a willingness to step forward, even before we're sure what the next step is. The sacred often shows up just past the edges of what we thought we could handle.

This Week's Practice: Make Space on Purpose

- Clear something out a drawer, a calendar block, a thought pattern. Make literal space for something new
- Speak a blessing over what's ahead, even if it feels uncertain.
- Ask God: What might you be making room for in me? In us?
