Throughout all of next year, we will be using this foundational commandment of Jesus, to love our neighbors as we love ourselves (Matthew 22:34-40), to guide our gatherings for Worship, fellowship, and service. Soon, we will publish a schedule that shares more specifically where our Gospel Focus will lead, including weekly sermon titles and scripture selections for the whole year. But let me at least share with you now the monthly focus:


January - What is Love?
February - Learning to Love Yourself
March - LENT: Rebuilding From the Dust
April - Who is Our Neighbor?
May - When Neighbors Feel Like Enemies
June - Love Wins!
July - Pursuing a Liberating Love
August - God's Unbreakable Love
September - STEWARDSHIP: When Love Is Enough
October - A Just Love
November - Responding to Love
December - ADVENT: Love Embodied

Loving our neighbors is as much about who we are as it is who they are. Building our capacity to love in the ways we are called by Christ requires attention and intention. In our worship in 2026, we will strengthen our ability to respond with grace, extend forgiveness, hear with patience, and hope with expectation by always reminding ourselves how God's love can mend and heal and set free. For when we lean into love, we are leaning into the strength of God the Creator, Jesus the Christ, the Spirit of the Most High, and all the angels and saints of heaven. Love is all that is next for us, so in the meantime, let our love make Earth more like Heaven.

Through the end of the year, we will be collecting gently used coats FOR ALL AGES for the Salvation Army. There is a barrel next to the information desk to receive your coats.


Offering Envelopes


