## Radical Welcome, Restless Hearts

For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost. Luke 19:10

Zacchaeus wasn't anyone's idea of holy. He had taken advantage of people, built wealth on the backs of others, and lived in the tension between power and isolation. Yet when Jesus passed through town, something in him stirred. He wanted to see. To belong. To start again.

And Jesus noticed. He didn't call him down to shame him, he called him down to dinner. That's what divine love looks like: it interrupts, invites, and insists that transformation is possible.

But make no mistake - it's also uncomfortable. The welcome of Jesus reaches into the places we'd rather avoid. It draws near to the sinner, the skeptic, and the scandalized. It tells us that no one is too far gone, and no one is done growing.

The radical part of grace isn't that God welcomes us; it's that we're expected to do the same. To see those who are trying to change. To make room for those reaching for a more faithful life, even when they don't yet have it all figured out.

#### This Week's Practice: Seeing and Welcoming

- Notice who might be "up in a tree" in your life curious, cautious, wanting connection.
- Offer an invitation that costs you a little comfort: a meal, a conversation, a seat beside you.
- Pray each day: God, help me welcome the change You're working in others, and in me.

#### Before You Go...

Jesus didn't wait for Zacchaeus to get it all right. He simply said, "I'm coming to your house today." Maybe that's what grace still sounds like. An invitation to come down and start again.
