

IMC MLK Scholarship Fund Program Guidelines

The Interdenominational Ministers' Conference (IMC) of Greater Harrisburg was founded in the late 50's by a group of Ministers lead by Reverend Franklin L. Henley. In addition to the need for fellowship among the brotherhood, the group of ministers also wanted to impact the city of Harrisburg in a positive way and provide leadership for issues confronting the community. A guiding mission statement was drafted to define the group's purpose:

"Inasmuch as the equality of humankind, justice, emancipation and liberation from oppression are real and moral issues which merit the full attention of any and every proponent of the Christian faith, there necessitates the existence of an organization of concerned clergy dedicated to initiating, supporting, and upholding sound and sincere efforts toward the achievement of full human dignity as well as promoting every opportunity for the realization of all of humanity's potential toward constructive productivity under God."

The purpose of the IMC MLK scholarship is to provide financial assistance for college students who are pursuing academic achievement while also helping to make a positive change in their community. The spirit of MLK is service to others, which is why MLK Day is also known as a day of service.

The IMC MLK scholarship will be awarded to students from the community who exemplify service and contribution to uplifting those around them.

NOTE: Scholarship funds will be awarded to the student upon evidence of registration in an accredited higher educational institution.

Criteria and eligibility

- 1. Applicant must be registered and enrolled in a college, university, or higher educational institution.
- 2. Applicant must demonstrate community involvement, academic achievement, and educational enrollment.
- 3. All applicants must complete the scholarship application and return it before the deadline.
- 4. Applicants must submit a 250–500-word essay detailing their future goals and how they will give back to their community.
- 5. Applicants must provide two community references, including a teacher, community advocate, Pastor, or a former or current employer.

General Instructions

- 1. The deadline for scholarship applications is December.
- 2. Refer to the application process below for a list of the supporting documents needed (i.e., reference forms, evidence of GPA, etc.) Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 3. If any question does not apply to you in this application, please put N/A in the space.
- 4. Type and print legibly. Illegible applications will not be considered.
- 5. You will be notified regarding the status of your application.

Application Process:

Applicant must submit the following items:

- 1. Completed application form (if handwritten, please print legibly)
- 2. Letter of application addressed to the Scholarship Committee. The letter should contain a brief explanation about yourself and your college plans (college/university, intended major, and anticipated start date). The letter should not exceed one (1) page.
- 3. Two (2) letters of recommendation from a choice of high school teachers, administrators, counselors, employers, or an individual with significant knowledge of the applicant's experience and involvement.
- 4. Personal Essay. Essay must be at least 1-2 typed pages, double-spaced, 12 pt / Times New Roman font. The essay shall contain no grammatical errors.
- 5. In addition to the above items, the applicant must demonstrate some community involvement, which includes a church, a civic organization, or a non-profit organization.

The deadline for the application is **December.** Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered.

Sample Letter of Application for Scholarship

This is a suggested format for a "letter of application". Please revise as needed for your own purposes.

Dear Scholarship Committee (or use the name of the person you are addressing)

First paragraph – identify what you are applying for

I am applying for (name of scholarship) because (your reason for applying).

Second paragraph (or combine with first paragraph) – explain your goals

I want to pursue a degree in (career) because (describe your interests and goals).

Third paragraph – talk about yourself, including what the scholarship committee wants to know about you Tell about your important life experiences, your activities in school, your community or church, and what you have learned from these experiences. Emphasize any responsibilities you have had or awards you received. Answer any questions the scholarship committee wants to know about you.

Fourth paragraph – summarize how you have met their requirements

I have met all the qualifications and have included (list items, if any, you are attaching to back up what you have referred to in your application). Add any other information they have requested, such as names of references and contact information.
