
The Banner



In the 73rd Psalm the author is struggling. It is a struggle that is familiar to many of us. In fact, the psalmist tells us, he almost fell prey to the lies of the world in his struggle. Consider his words, "But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled, my steps had nearly slipped" (Psalm 73:2).

Why? He tells us why he almost stumbled as we read on.

- 3 For I was envious of the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
- 4 For they have no pangs until death; their bodies are fat and sleek.

5 They are not in trouble as others are, they are not stricken like the rest of mankind. Psalm 73:3-5

Do you see? This might be a familiar struggle for you. Why is it that people who do not care about God at all are rich and seem to have no worries? They drive nice cars, have great jobs, fat bank accounts, and retire in luxury. And why do I seem to have to struggle day by day to get by and feed my family?

Have you ever asked these questions? I have. I may not be in desperate need today, but I certainly have been, and I know people who

are. It is comforting to know that God's people ask these questions. It is even more comforting to know that the Bible has an answer. In fact, the psalmist in Psalm 73 finds the answer.

26 Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire besides you.
26 My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.
Psalm 73:25-26

The answer, the solution to the struggle, is not God giving us what the rich have, but rather His teaching us to find our needs fulfilled in Him. We find this theme running throughout the Bible.

The Apostle Paul is thankful for the support of the Philippian church as they provide for his needs.

11 Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. 12 I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need.
13 I can do all things through him who strengthens me.
Phillipians 4:11-13

6 But godliness with contentment is great gain, 7 for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. 8 But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. 9 But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs. 1 Timothy 6:6-10

Godliness with contentment is great gain. Do you think of gain in this way? Most people think of gain, progress, success in life as accumulating possessions, degrees, status, and growing one's family. The Bible does not think of gain in this way. No, gain is closeness to God and being content with what He gives.

Likewise, the author of Hebrews warns us of the alternative to contentment, a devotion to money.

Keep your life free from the love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Hebrews 13:5

It is the very nature of money to leave. We cannot keep it. We cannot take it with us. But Jesus will never leave us. Moreover, we cannot serve both riches and Jesus.

24 "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money."

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? 26 Look at the

birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? 28 And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, 29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O

you of little faith? 31 Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

34 "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." Matthew 6:24-34

Being content transforms the little that we have into an abundance as we are thankful to Jesus and learn to trust Him through every challenge. Do you believe that Jesus cares for you? If so, we need to live like we believe that. When we do, God will give us a peace that passes this world's understanding. Seek Him above all else and He will take care of you.†
