A FRIEND CALLED COURAGE

As a kid, our family had a rotation of shared responsibilities in the home. The chore I detested most was taking out the trash. While part of this was due to my deep-rooted belief that such tasks should fall to my brothers, the bigger part was a pervasive fear I had of dragging the trash down the hill to the disposal bin. This usually happened at the end of the day, after dark had already descended on our wooded acreage. My most terrifying fear was that I would be consumed by wild creatures, all in the name of fulfilling my responsibility. Despite this fear, my parents were not

convinced I should be exempt, and I carried the trash out every few days. I'm so glad they didn't let me off the hook. Over time, I learned strategies to distract myself and developed a solid uphill running endurance as I raced to the back door, heart pounding, convinced my worst monsters were right behind me. In the process, I also learned about courage. I had to learn how to hold fear and commitment together, to take the step forward, even when I didn't feel ready.

Reflecting on 2025, courage was the friend I didn't want to need, but in truth, the one I needed most. God showed me a new way of living this past year. It was humbling, sometimes painful, but ultimately beautiful. I also learned that courage grows in both the quiet of faithful, daily decisions and in the raw, vulnerability of community. Courage pushes us to move forward into spaces and places we might not feel ready for. It requires us to be grounded in the promises of God, holding a heart-level trust in His goodness—even when we don't yet see the full picture. Courage asks us why we started in the first place and whether we're ready to pivot and put in the hard work. It calls us to replace perfection with obedience, entrusting the outcome to the One who called us. Courage is faith in action.

That's what makes 2026 such an exciting year ahead. Embracing courage means there's so much possibility on the horizon. *God has used your prayers and partnership to build courage in us for what He is calling us to faithfully steward.*

August: We packed up our Iowa home and transitioned our life and ministry to Minnesota.

September: Cory joined our team at the Converge Heartland regional gathering in South Dakota for learning and connection with pastors and leaders.

October: Brooke traveled to Orlando for partnership development training as we work toward restoring our support to 100%.

November: We facilitated the Forge United Discovery Day in northern Minnesota with ten churches discerning how God is calling them to reach the unreached. Brooke also attended the S2 Conference in Phoenix, encouraged and equipped alongside teammates from across Converge.

December: We enjoyed a season of connection with some of you through email, newsletter and photo updates and face to face conversations. We spent time with family over the Christmas season as well.
