



: I am the Lord your God.

Typically, we don't recommend Leviticus as a go to 'first read' for people when we think of beloved books or passages in the Bible. It's kind of like taking a walk down an unplowed path after a huge snowstorm: it feels heavy and tiring and overwhelming. Just me? Recently though, as I have been rereading the Old Testament and came to this book, something struck me differently.

I began to read through these laws God put in place for his people and noticed a pattern. Although I didn't count, quite consistently, God breaks from his instructions with a declarative: "I am the Lord." While it seems like a sort of obvious thing to repeat over and over again, I realized as I read it anew, what depth and meaning it adds to this tsunami of laws and instructions for ritual sacrifice coming at His people. **Who God is brings meaning and purpose to everything we do as humans.** There is

fearsome awe, surrender and love-led obedience that naturally flow out a deep knowing of who God is and who we are in Him. The laws are insurmountable, yes. Apart from God's help we are incapable of the perfect standard set before us in the law. But we would be blind not to notice the descriptive lengths God gave the Israelites of how to have fellowship with Him, despite their sin, and how even the temporary sacrifices of the Old Testament were means through which God chose to stay connected when humans, his creation, rejected Him. God chose to continually extend His mercy and love, knowing how continually captivated we are by lesser things.

The perfect Lamb of God is the One who clothes us in confidence that we are accepted and loved by God in Him, and a deeper grasping of His goodness is what is propelling Cory and I into what is next. When the majority of the "work" we *planned* to do is an ocean away, God is re-orienting our identities around Him and His purposes. We are so thankful for the ongoing work of God in our hearts.
