


TO REACH AND DISCIPLE 2000 PEOPLE WITHIN THE NEXT 5 YEARS

OUR STORY

Our church was founded by **Antone Linn**. He was a circuit riding preacher who rode his horse into Kitsap County and sensed God wanting him to start a church.

He often stayed in the homes of different people, or he slept in the woods with his horse. The original name for our church was the Swedish Christian Free Church and met at the Clear Creek Grange Hall.



1930

Property was purchased for \$200 in Old Town Silverdale to one day build a church building. The church name was changed to the Silverdale Gospel Tabernacle Assembly.

1942

Our name changed to Silverdale Bible Church under the leadership of Pastor Everett Montgomery

1945

Emanuel Nazarenus became the pastor. Having a background in construction, Pastor Nazarenus, led the charge to build the church in Old Town Silverdale. It is still registered as a historical building today.







Under the leadership of Pastor Fred Holt, our church became known as **Silverdale Baptist Church**.

A young pastor from lowa accepted the call to be our next pastor. His name was Pastor Curt DeGraaff. Under his leadership, our church purchased property on HWY 303 for \$125,000 in the early 1980's.



1989

Our first service at our current site was held on April 30, 1989. The church was around 300 in size. In 1991, our church brought on Barry Bandara as our Youth Pastor. He served in this role until he moved to California in 2000.



1994

Additional space was added for a growing church that included a new nursery, office space and a gymnasium/youth room.



After Pastor DeGraaff moved to Kentucky in 2003, our church called **Barry Bandara** to return as our Lead Pastor in 2005.





2013

We changed our name to **GracePoint Church.**

2015

Due to outgrowing our old auditorium, we expanded our facility to include a larger auditorium, lobby, and much needed bathrooms.

- This Sunday will be the start of our HORIZON INITIATIVE giving. We are asking our people to consider giving a large initial gift to start this project this Sunday.

HORIZON NEXT STEPS

PRAY

The Macedonian church was seen to have faith beyond the horizon. (See 2 Corinthians 8) They gave themselves first to the Lord and then, by the will of God, to the church. Our faith beyond the horizon doesn't come from our personality or even our emotions but seeking God through prayer.

Begin praying for:

- Ways you need to grow in your faith
- Who God wants you to begin praying for and then inviting to your church
- Your pastors and church leaders as we pursue this vision to REACH and DISCIPLE 2000 people in the next five years

Praying is also imperative for what to financially give for the Horizon Initiative. Ask God what HE wants you to give

after all, it's His money in the first place. Surrender all you are and all you have to Him. Be bold as you pray!

REFLECT

As you pray, have the audacity to believe that God actually hears your prayers – because He does! The key to our prayers is the authenticity of our hearts. Reflect on what God has done in your life and family. Reflect on how you have grown spiritually in the past and how you need to continue to grow in your relationship with the Lord. Reflect on how God may use you to bring others to Himself. If you are married, talk with your spouse about these areas of reflection and where you sense the Holy Spirit leading.

Reflect on this **HORIZON challenge** (looking up, out, and beyond ourselves) as a new line of demarcation in your spiritual journey. It's a new day, a new dawn, and a new horizon for you!

TAKE A STEP TOWARDS THE HORIZON

Discipleship and stewardship go hand in hand. As we go deeper into our relationship with God, we learn what it means to value Him above all else and all the ways we need to live in obedience. Growing as a follower of Jesus is a journey of ongoing steps of trust and exercising of our faith muscles. We will not grow without taking a step of faith. So, growing in financial stewardship requires us to take a step in trusting Jesus to give what He wants us to give. We do this because we value God more than any commitment to generosity for the specific purpose of seeing more people meet, know, and follow Jesus.

USE THE HORIZON JOURNEY

The Horizon Journey is a tool designated to help us understand different ways to look up, out, and beyond ourselves. The Horizon Journey will focus on different behaviors and attitudes of our heart that God wants to continually shape for His glory and for our improvement.

THE HORIZON JOURNEY

There are **five stages** in one's **giving journey**. Where would you say you are?

INITIAL GIVER

An **Initial Giver** is someone who decides to give for the first time out of a response to God's Word about giving. This is someone who decides to give something and trust God to supply for their needs. This is typically an initial step of trusting God with their finances with a new understanding that God is the Owner of all that they have received.

CONSISTENT GIVER

A **Consistent Giver** is someone who decides to give something consistently to exercise the discipline of giving regularly. A good habit to start is to give immediately after receiving a paycheck. Often, someone who decides to make their gift an online reoccurring gift will be someone who is learning the behavior of consistency.

Non-reoccurring givers can be consistent givers as well; it just requires more discipline.

INTENTIONAL GIVER

An Intentional Giver is someone who begins to think about their giving in relation to how they spend their money on other things. For example, this type of giver begins asking the questions like, "Why am I giving more money for my cell phone plan than I am giving to God? Should I be giving to God more than I am giving to my rent or mortgage each month?"

This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they prioritize and spend their money with God's kingdom in mind. This may be the point of intentionality, when someone begins to tithe (a tenth) for the first time, deliberately reflecting a certain amount or percentage they want to give to God.

SURRENDERED GIVER

A **Surrendered Giver** is someone who recognizes the cost Christ paid on the cross for us and is surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. A Surrendered Giver gives in a way that changes them. Their giving governs their spending/savings rather than their spending/savings governs their giving. A Surrendered Giver isn't concerned by what they are giving but more concerned with what they are not giving and why.

A **Surrendered Giver** is not looking to give the minimum amount that the Scriptures teach but looking to give above and beyond the minimum. This type of giver views giving as a joy and is immediately excited to give when God surprises them with extra income.

ETERNAL GIVER

An **Eternal Giver** is someone who thinks about the long-term effects of generosity rather than the month-to-month or year-to-year generosity.

An **Eternal Giver** makes decisions in light of eternity for the long term rather than the earthly short term. They process how large purchases could impact their giving and then make decisions to guard or even increase their giving as part of how they process these big decisions. Much like a Surrendered Giver makes a commitment with a will to govern their monthly or yearly giving decisions, an Eternal Giver makes lifetime giving commitments that are part of their long-term giving plans. These plans often include "giving plans" that advance God's kingdom even after they have passed away from this earth.





FIRST PRIORITY

Scripture: Haggai 1:1-11; Matthew 6: 21,33; Colossians 1:17-18

God understands there are lots of important things in our life. However, God deserves and desires to

be the FIRST PRIORITY in our lives, our homes, our relationships, and in our finances. God blesses us when we put Him first. God withholds blessings when we don't.

Initiative has a simple definition but an impactful

application. God took initiative in loving and saving us. We need to take initiative in our response to Him. So, what are you asking God to do? What are you imagining God to do? For whose glory are you asking? The Horizon Initiative can only be accomplished if we take a step of faith and ask God to do what only He can do!

INWARD vs. OUTWARD

As sinners, we are hardwired to be inward focused. It comes natural to us. However, it requires work

and a steadfast effort to have an outward focus on other people. Every church has a gravitational pull towards becoming an inward-focused church. This will eventually cause a church to die. This was never God's design.

FEAR vs. FAITH

Scripture: Deuteronomy 8:1-6; Malachi 3:8-12
