

ICEBREAKER

What is the first thing you remember believing even though you had no proof?

CONTEXT

In this passage, we find Jesus back in Cana (where He turned water into wine), where He will perform another miracle. The son of an official in the area is sick and dying, and his father sets out to find Jesus to heal his son.

PASSAGE

John 4:43-54

DISCUSS

How would you define a miracle? What would be the criteria for it to be a miracle?

Do you believe that signs and wonders still happen today? Why or why not?

DISCUSS CONTINUED

Have you ever prayed for a miracle and received it? Have you ever prayed for a miracle that didn't get your desired answer? Share about your experience.

The official wants Jesus to come to heal his son, but Jesus says, "Go; your son will live." Then the man leaves. How do you think you would have responded? Why?

At what point in the story did the official demonstrate his faith in Jesus? Why is this important? What does this tell you about the nature of faith?

NEXT STEPS

Ephesians 3:20 tells us that God can do "far more abundantly than all that we ask or think."

Are you asking God for a miracle right now? Do you know someone who is? Take some time as a group to share and pray that God would intervene.
