
WELCOME

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

Children are always welcome in worship! Here are a few ways we strive to support young families on Sunday morning.

Grace Spaces

Grace Spaces are inclusive spots around our Worship Center and Narthex for children (and anyone else!) to play, color, and be included in worship comfortably.

Calm Lounge

The Calm Lounge is located in the Chapel adjacent to the Worship Center and is available for children accompanied by a caregiver who are in need of a diaper change, a feeding, or a friendly space to work through a big feeling. Worship is livestreamed so caregivers aren't cutoff from worship.

Worship Bags

Located near all four Grace Spaces, these bags are geared toward different ages (look at the tags) and include books, activities, crafts, and fidgets to keep little hands busy.

Sunday Open Gym

The gym is open for families in between worship services on Sundays at 10 a.m. Playing is a great way to connect with other children! Faith Forum for adults happens simultaneously next door for parents who wish to attend while their child(ren) play. (see page 16).

Join the faith formation exploration through Faith Lab, a dynamic program designed for children from ages 4 through Grade 5. Every Wednesday evening, we come together to explore biblical stories through engaging activities, meaningful art, and interactive discussions. Using materials from Illustrated Ministry, our sessions focus on listening, reflecting, and sharing God's love in a supportive and creative environment.

In response to the busy schedules of today's families, we've shifted our faith formation to Wednesdays, giving families flexibility and easing the weekend rush. Start your Wednesday with Children's Choir led by the talented Sonia Esch, where children learn to lead worship through music (email Sonia at wisokiwi@msn.com to indicate interest in participating). Then, transition into Faith Lab with Sarah Olson and dedicated volunteers. right before Dinner Church. Head to Dinner Church next, a unique meal and worship experience that fosters intergenerational dialogue, celebrates shared joys and challenges, and nurtures our faith community.

Following Dinner Church, check out one of the many options available for every age and stage, like FAFA (Fellowship & Faith Affinity group for elementary ages), supervised Open Gym*, Middle School Confirmation, or Adult Confirmation.

Milestones in January (please register for each Milestone separately, all begin at 5:20 pm and conclude before Dinner Church):

January 7: Baptism Anniversary (geared to ages birth to Kindergarten). Get out the party horns and hats – it's time to celebrate all of God's beloveds welcomed into the family over the past year with a Baptism birthday party!

January 14: Bible Discovery (receive a NRSV Bible, geared to grades 2-5). This class is for children ready to graduate from the Spark Story Bible and develop skills to engage with their new NRSV Bible. We will also recognize children who have completed this class with a blessing in worship.

January 21: Worship Orientation (geared to ages birth to 3). Worship shapes even the littlest hearts — as we bring our children to worship, they begin to recognize God's voice through the familiar rhythms of song, prayer, and Word. This orientation helps families create meaningful worship habits at home and in church, offering practical tools to help your child feel engaged, included, and at home in God's presence.

Baptism

Generally, baptisms happen at either service (9:00 am or 11:00 am) on the first Sunday of each month, or at the 11:00 am service only on other Sundays of the month.

Baptism is foundational to a life in Christ and is the most natural beginning point in the lifelong journey of faith. It is through baptism that we are first received into the Christian community, named and claimed as children of God forever. Through the water and word, we receive God's love, forgiveness and peace. So everyone involved in this important sacrament understands and takes those promises seriously, Trinity offers baptism preparation. Every family scheduling their first baptism at Trinity is required to complete the Baptism Milestone kit and have a follow-up conversation with a pastor. Parents, and sponsors when possible, are asked to complete this milestone in advance of the date set for baptism.

What Confirmation is (and isn't)?

Again, Confirmation is a milestone, it is not a graduation. It's a celebration of growth and what's next in a life of faith. Also known as "The Affirmation of Baptism," basically, it's also an opportunity for Christians to affirm for themselves in front of their faith community the growth that they have made in the promises that their parents, sponsors, and congregation made for them at their baptism. They are encouraged to take on the faith that was and continues to be gifted to them through God' never-ending grace and love.

Wednesday Night Schedule

God's people have always celebrated the physical and spiritual nourishment of what happens around the Table. We are excited to continue with Wednesday night Dinner Church. Weekends are busy. Patterns and rituals, including worshiping as a family, have been hard to reset post-pandemic. Dinner Church offers a different kind of space to build on Trinity's values of dialog and discussion, room to accommodate our whole bodies, mingling with multiple generations, and a chance to lift our shared joys and challenges as followers of Jesus.

Confirmation Structure

Our system is a large-group/ small-group set up, with a large group presentation followed by small group check in and conversation about the topic taught. Each child is placed in a small group of about 6-8 kids with a friend or two and a caring adult leader. We strive for much more than simply instruction—we want kids to learn, of course, but we also want kids to connect with each other in small groups and share the highs and lows in their life. In short, we want our program to be about ministry as much as instruction. The parts of our process:

Learning – We cycle through the basics of the Old and New Testament, Martin Luther and the Small Catechism, Jesus, the hot topics in Christianity and more, depending on the year. We teach in engaging ways that cover all learning styles: art, music, video, skits are all involved to help get our teaching across.

Service – Various times during the year, groups will have the opportunity to gather for a service event or other fun event as a small group or with another small group. If we want a child to learn how to be a servant, we think it best to help them serve! In the past we've been part of meal packing, fundraising, mission trip support, and other various events.

Play – In a small group, fun experiences bond you together and allow you to tell good stories about one another. With this closeness comes more honest conversations in small group. Each year groups hold events for fun in which small groups can participate. We also are planning lock-ins, retreats, and other various events for all our kids to enjoy together.

Home - We do believe that parents/caregivers need to be a central part of the adolescent Confirmation journey. We don't want to run another "drop off" program where parents/ caregivers are not called to be a part of the process. Various studies show us that no one is a bigger influence on the faith of a child than a parent. We do realize that planning intentional time to talk about faith and life can be a tough and even uncomfortable proposition. We equip and partner with parents and caregivers with the time, motivation, and the tools to begin regular faith talk in the home. We send out a weekly email with updates on what we are covering at 6/7/8 Confirmation and include questions to help guide some regular caring conversations. We also schedule various "All-In" sessions during the year so parents and caregivers can get together with other adults for practical advice from various professional theological and child development specialists. In short, we don't want to replace a parent as an influencer of faith for the child. We want to partner together with parents, so kids have the most positive and powerful Confirmation journey possible!

9TH GRADE FAITH FORMATION

Confirmation Day and Entry into High School Ministries Ninth grade is when we get closer to the Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation) Day milestone and participation in high school ministries! Ninth graders have learned much and enjoyed their time in Middle School Confirmation (hopefully!) and all of this leads up to Confirmation Day on Sunday, Oct. 26, 2025 and High School Ministry after. Here is a quick peek at how the last part of the Confirmation Milestone and High School Ministry is going to look.

OUTREACH MISSIONS

Refugee Support And Resettlement

Trinity Lutheran Church has a longstanding history of helping "newcomers" resettle in Minnesota. Initially these new comers were primarily immigrants from Scandinavian and European countries in need of food, clothing, shelter, community and employment opportunities. In the 1970s and 80S, many of these newcomers were refugees from Vietnam.

More recently, Trinity has been involved in the resettlement of refugees from Afghanistan and other war-torn counties. It spearheaded a coalition of churches and other organizations a few years ago to help resettle a family of five from Afghanistan. Today that family is thriving.

This past year the Missions Team:

- Conducted fund-raising and "basic living needs" drives to assist the Minnesota Council of Churches' refugee resettlement program when federal funding was abruptly cut in January.
- Organized Réfugee Sunday in June featuring speakers from Vietnam, Afghanistan and Russia
- Helped establish and financially support Refugee Housing Minnesota, which in its first 6 months helped over 100 newcomers find or maintain housing. (refugeehousingMN.org)

We continue to establish relationships with other area churches, mosques and social organizations to help with refugee resettlement funding and create a core of volunteers.

GLOBAL COMPANIONS

Tanzania

The focus for Tanzania mission has three primary elements centered in walking alongside (using our Accompaniment Model of Missions) our Tanzania mission partners:

- our companion congregation relationship with the Mwatasi Lutheran Church in the rural high country of the Iringa district of Tanzania
- 2) secondary school and college scholarships for students from Mwatasi. Scholarships are a critical need and are welcomed throughout the year in any amount. Secondary school scholarships average \$350 per student per year. We have been committed to sponsoring about 26 students each year from our partner congregation in Mwatasi.
- The medical ministries started by the late Dr. Mark Jacobson (a son of this congregation) in Arusha. We also maintain involvement with partner organizations such as Iringa Hope (savings and loan agriculture cooperative), St. Paul Partners (water engineering), water projects in Mwatasi village, and Global Health Ministries. We work with Bega Kwa Bega, an agency of the ELCA Saint Paul Area Synod, to further our cooperation and relationship. We are planning a trip to Tanzania for the congregational members in Fall 2026 or Fall 2027. Look for information on our website.
