Spaciousness and Graciousness

I have had lots of great memories flood back to me in these last few weeks as we have a big farewell and blessed retirement to Pastor Chris. Moments of connection and ministry milestones. Like paddling through time and the open waters and trails with so many sacred spots.

One moment that keeps coming back to me is sitting outside of the old Tin Bins coffee shop (which has gone through lots of transition over the years) with Pastor Chris following her sabbatical in the summer of 2022.

It was the first time we had reconnected and I was going through both our usual updates and pastoral care needs, as well as a bit of my take on the "State of the Church" heading into the fall program year.

She had been around the country and around the world visiting these contemplative thin/holy places, soaking in the wisdom of desert mystics and nuns and the caretakers of cathedrals.

At Trinity, we were trying to keep things rolling, inviting folks back into community, back to the Table after the long season of distancing, and the ache of rising political polarization and the impacts of the death of George Floyd moving through the justice system.

It wasn't an easy time to be the church or the Body of Christ in the St. Croix Valley, but folks were stepping up to lead, we were managing as best we could, being the church in ALL circumstances, and finding creative ways to invite others into life in the Gospel.

As we talked and I brain-dumped, I could viscerally feel the impact and recharge of her sabbatical, a sense of renewal and capacity to hold it all together, her hands and heart outstretched in this amazing gift of spaciousness and graciousness.

This is always the hope of true sabbath and the invitation of sabbatical but it still surprised me.

This is always how I experienced Pastor Chris, but it was also supercharged in that initial re-entry and full to the brim in standing in that liminal time, a moment of ending and new beginning, a cycle that repeats in our lives through so many seasons, forever in motion unfolding.

That spaciousness and graciousness is what I keep coming back to in a well of gratitude – moments in ministry together here at Trinity, both with Pastor Chris and our staff and our leadership with so many of you showing up for each other and showing up with God's spaciousness and graciousness.

God's spaciousness and graciousness holds the whole of what we are facing together as a community right now, both in immense gratitude and immense grief. God's spaciousness and graciousness in Christ flings wide outstretched arms that carries us, a well of support that we lean into, that we share.

In this transition time of graduations, retirement, moving equipment out to the Drive-in for worship, and planning to welcome our new Interim Pastor Jen Hackbarth (who is an amazing Interim Pastor!), my continued prayer for us is to draw and lean on God's spaciousness and graciousness.

Space for gratitude. Grace in our grief. Space for shared memory. Grace in this new normal.

Space for tears of joy. Grace for different ideas and ways of being.

Space for brain and heart dumps. Grace for beginning again in Beloved relationship.

God's spaciousness and graciousness has the capacity to hold all of it, all of our hearts, all of who we are in the Body of Christ at Trinity.

APRIL 2025 INCOME VS EXPENSE

- FYTD Giving through April was \$933,474. (105% of Budget) 2024 YTD Giving was \$917,269.
- Total Income minus Missions- was \$1,286,905. (117% of Budget) 2024 Total Income was \$1,207,080.
- Total Expenses minus Missions were \$1,074,588. (97% of budget) 2024 Expenses were \$1,109,185.
- As of May 1, 2025, the FSB Line of Credit balance was \$0.

APRIL 2025 COMPREHENSIVE CAMPAIGN UPDATE

- Total Pledged: \$1,853,458. Total Contributed: \$1,609,024.
- Remaining Balance: \$244,433. Percent Complete: 86.81%.

MORTGAGE

As of May 1, 2025, the Thrivent mortgage balance was \$1,740,861. There will be an additional check from the Comprehensive Campaign to principle in May for \$12,021.83. Additional funds received from Pastor Chris' honorariums to her retirement will be applied to Mortgage Reduction.

FACILITIES

The 3rd Street Heritage Chapel Exterior deferred maintenance project (tuckpointing/structural repair) is officially underway. It is expected to be completed by Mid-July. This project is the 2nd funded project from the Comprehensive Campaign. There continues to be work being done at the Drive-in – to include the replacement of the roof on the projection building - with the hope it will be done by Memorial Day.

SUMMER OFFICE HOURS

During the summer - from June 1 through September 1 - the church office will be open from 9AM – 4PM (Monday through Thursday).

SECURITY TASK FORCE

This team has been established to address current needs for additional security. Some of the things being considered are:

- an updated Security Policy and Procedure Manual.
- the TLC library possibly relocating to the room across from the River Room.
- improved security for the 4th Street doors.

NEW WEBSITE

Lastly, we wanted you to know that we are currently working on a new and updated Trinity website. We hope to launch before July 1. We will keep you posted.




Chosen Names Matter to God-Learning Together 101

Do you know the origin story of your name? Has your name ever changed since it was first given to you?

ELCA Pastor David L Hansen, a writer, consultant, and coach who helps congregations experience renewal, reflected on the impact of a person's name, following the election and naming of Pope Leo.



Pr. Hansen writes:

Yesterday, everyone called him Robert. Today everyone calls him Leo.

One day they called him Abram, the next Abraham. One day Simon, the next Peter. One day Jacob, the next Israel.

Chosen names are that easy. They deserve to be respected by us all.

Chosen names matter to God. They should also matter (and be respected by) the people who love God.

Names matter. To God - and God's people.

The past several years the Trinity Team I am blessed to chair has gone by the name RIC Team. We are aware that some people know-and many don't know-what RIC stands for: Reconciling In Christ. This name was given to the team based on the past. As the team's current purpose, focus, and future vision has shifted, we are giving this team a new name - the Pride Justice **Team**. This new name better describes who we are today, our purpose, and our identity. It may take some time for some of us to adjust and shift to the new name, but we are confident we-and all of you-can and will make the change-because it matters to us and to God and God's work.

Stories throughout history include someone's name being changed both formally and informally. Reasons include a cultural practice or ritual, immigration records, a marriage or divorce, change in vocation, poor spelling skills, or a personal recognition of a new identity, just to name a few.

It can be common practice among the LGBTQIA+ community that individuals choose a new name for the identity they

now understand to be authentically them, rather than an identity prescribed for them early in their story. That Chosen Name Matters.

Faith communities, like Trinity, have opportunities to support individual's name changes through practicing inclusive hospitality, a curiosity and willingness to learn people's stories, and the rituals and ministry offered by its people. Use of nametags is one example to help all of us. At times, a more specialized experience may be needed.



An intentional example is The Naming Project (https://www.thenamingproject.org/about/) a 5-day summer camp for youth (a camp for adults is also available!), where the mission and goal is to "provide a safe and sacred space where youth of all sexual orientations and gender identities are named and claimed by a loving God; explore and share faith; experience healthy and life-giving community; reach out to others; and advocate for systemic change in church and society."

What a gift to know you are named and claimed by God, and you have a community who affirms and loves you! Chosen names matter and lives are transformed, especially when God's presence and unconditional love is experienced as part of the naming!


