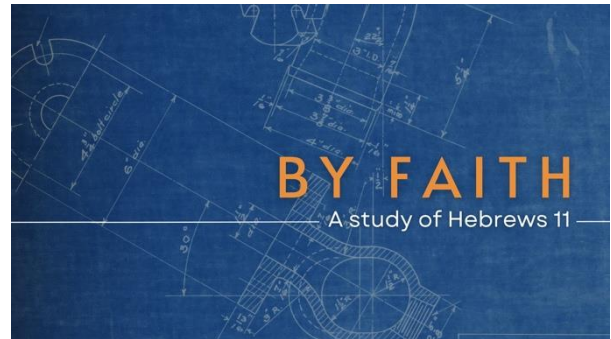


Discipleship Group SERIES QUESTIONS



By Faith - Hebrews 11

Message Series

Hebrews 11 is often called the “Hall of Fame of Faith.” It is a chapter filled with names and stories of people who trusted God in different seasons. But it is not meant to give us spiritual heroes to admire. It shows us what it looks like to live by faith in the real world. Hebrews was written to a weary, pressured church tempted to drift, shrink back, or settle. These examples are not given so we put people on a pedestal, but so we learn how to trust God when His promises feel distant and the present feels uncertain. We live in a world that trains us to trust what we can see, measure, manage, verify, and feel. Hebrews 11 calls us to something deeper. **Faith is not ignoring reality. It is learning to live beyond what we see by trusting what God has said.**

WEEK 3 Background

Faith often begins when God calls us beyond what feels familiar, comfortable, or predictable. Abraham was asked to leave home and follow God without knowing the full destination or timeline. Instead of giving Abraham a detailed plan, God gave him a promise—and Abraham chose to trust the One who made it. Hebrews 11 reminds us that faith does not require having the whole picture; it means taking the next step when the future is still unclear.

- What do we learn about God in this passage?
- What is God teaching the people in the passage?
- What is the Holy Spirit teaching you personally?
- What will you do with what God is teaching you?

WEEK 3 Questions

- In Genesis 12:1–4, what specific things was Abraham asked to leave behind? Why would that calling have been difficult?
- Hebrews 11:8 says Abraham obeyed “even though he did not know where he was going.” What does that reveal about the nature of biblical faith?
- In Genesis 15:1–6, what fears or questions does Abraham bring to God? How does God respond to him?
- Across these passages, what seems more central: Abraham understanding God’s plan, or Abraham trusting God’s character?
- Where do you see the tension between trusting God’s promise and wanting a detailed plan, both in Scripture and in your own life?
