Holy Family & St. John Mary Vianney, Catholic Parishes of Kirkland, WA This Discipleship Survey sought a reliable, individual-level picture of how discipleship is believed, practiced, and experienced in our parish family—covering assent to core Catholic teachings (e.g., Eucharist, confession, conscience), personal prayer and sacramental life, parish belonging and encouragement, ministry participation and missionary impulse, communications, and open-ended reflections on strengths and needs within our faith community.


Responses from 1,243 parishioners (HFK 860, SJV 383) provide a robust baseline for parish planning (an additional 55 responses identified another parish and are excluded from the primary combined results). Whereas our Household Census asked who is here and how parish life is organized at home; this Discipleship Survey asks how the faith is understood, lived, and supported person-to-person. This survey, therefore, offers a vital complement – as determining 'who we are' manifests principally in 'what we believe.'



Sacraments and pastoral presence seem to form the center of gravity – with themes of belonging, family context, and everyday help being more of the principal bridges that carry grace into daily life.

1,033 usable responses. Many responses are positive but terse (e.g., "In all ways"), which keeps share figures conservative.

Sacramental / Liturgy	≈38%	This includes Mass/Eucharist/Communion (~19%), Homilies/Preaching (~16%), Adoration/Holy Hour (~6%), Music/Choir (~4%), and Confession/Reconciliation (~3%)	Parishioners most often locate their closeness to God in Mass, Eucharist, preaching, adoration, confession, and sacred music. That's a sign of a strong, grace-bearing core.
Clergy / Pastoral Presence	≈14%	Priests are often named explicitly (by title or name).	Pastoral leadership matters. The frequency with which priests/homilies are named indicates that preaching and presence are primary drivers of perceived spiritual impact.
Belonging & Relationships	≈15%	Community/Welcome (~15%)	Relational belonging is a key bridge. People describe growing close to God through "being known" inside the parish family.
Personal Prayer & Devotions	≈13%	Personal prayer/devotions (~7%), Scripture/Bible study (~4%), Retreats/Missions (~4%)	Many parishioners say their closeness to God grows through consistent practices—daily prayer, Scripture reading with a plan or small group, and occasional retreats (i.e., simple habits of discipleship).
Family & Youth	≈11%	Mentions of youth, family, children, school.	Mentions of youth/family/school indicate many experience closeness to God through family-oriented parish life.
Service, Outreach, Charity, etc.	≈3%		Service is valued but less central within responses.

Overall brand tends to a welcoming community with Eucharistic-centered worship, strong clergy, and lots of ways to get involved. The sacramental/liturgical depth is what many credit as the enduring good—but the first hook is a sense of belonging.

Community & Hospitality	46%	community/welcoming/friendly/ belonging "Welcoming community where you feel you belong from the first visit."	A common value proposition when recommending a parish (i.e., seldom unique). However, weighting to other themes is more insightful. May also consider this as a doorway that makes other aspects more plausible.
Clergy & Preaching	22%	priests/homilies/pastor/preaching "Mass and preaching that actually draw you closer to Jesus."	Priest presence and homilies are notable and frequently mentioned positively – a proven spiritual lever in how people 'experience' the parish.
Eucharistic Liturgy & Music	17%	Mass/Eucharist/Adoration/Holy Hour/Confession/sacred music/choir	The parish's spiritual center of gravity. Many point to the Eucharistic, homilies, and music as what makes all other welcoming holy.
Family & Youth (incl. School)	15%	families/children/youth/school "Families and kids are supported; there's a place for everyone."	Families particularly notice concrete supports. School/youth/kids' ministries show up strongly in "best about" answers.
Ministries, Service & Formation	13%	opportunities for/ministries/Bible study/volunteer/outreach "Many ministries—easy to get involved and serve."	Breadth of ministries exhibits as an easy opportunity to get involved.

Open Question (#50) "What do you believe is in greatest need of improvement at this parish?" "If you could fix one thing, what would it be?"

The share of certain themes does not *necessarily* stack rank problem issues so much as it charts a potential arc to parishioner mindfulness:

- 1. Reverent & Beautiful Worship
- 2. Strong Youth Pathways
- 3. Structured & Intimate Belonging
- 4. Ease & Clarity in Participation

Worship quality: Liturgy reverence & sacred music	20%		Calls for greater reverence, music quality/fit, and consistency. When quality of worship is perceived as strong, it's credited; when it's not, it's the first thing people would fix.
Youth & family support	17%	"More for teens and young adults so they stay engaged after Confirmation."	A pipeline for the young offering practical support for families and children (including teens and young adults) that extends beyond sacramental prep.
Small groups & community-building	13%	"Create small groups so newcomers can form friendships."	Desiring a belonging beyond warm sentiments and events, many ask for more structured and repeatable ways to build real relationships (e.g., small groups, fellowship, connection points between strangers and friends).
Scheduling & accessibility	11%	"Confession times and childcare that working families can actually use."	Mass, Confession, and Adoration times as well as childcare/nursery, parking, and general accessibility issues are mentioned – particularly for busy families and working professionals.
Ministry on-ramps & volunteer coordination	8%	"I want to volunteer, but it's unclear how to get involved."	This is less about the number of ministries and more about organization and visibility. People express a desire for clearer entry points to serve, better coordination/recruitment, and follow-through.

Also mentioned: Parish Family Unity (7%); Confession & Adoration availability (6%); Better homiletic content/length/clarity (4%); Communication being more clear and timely (4%); Facilities (3%)
