

Pre-Conditions for Interment

The Faith Presbyterian Church Cemetery is reserved for burial of dead humans, not other members of the animal kingdom. All state rules that are applicable for the burial of the dead must be met before the burial can proceed in the cemetery.

1. Trustees must give approval before a grave may be opened or closed.
2. Expenses involved in the opening and closing of graves, including snow removal to and at the grave site, are to be borne by heirs as a normal funeral expense.
3. Casket vaults and cremation vaults are mandatory. A vault must be concrete, steel or polyglass.
4. A grave may be used to inter more than one decedent, but this must be determined at the time of the first burial to allow for proper grave depth. Double deep casket burials are not allowed.
 - a. Up to 5 cremation vaults can be placed in a standard, full sized burial site, but only two markers are allowed per standard gravesite.
 - b. Two urns/vaults may be placed in a cremation burial site. Only one marker is allowed per cremation burial site.
5. Wilbert way devices for lowering the vault into the grave cannot be used due to sandy soil conditions which make the site susceptible to caving in.
6. Before any grave in the cemetery can be used, the following additional requirements must be met. No site purchases are considered final, nor is any agreement binding until and unless site obligations are paid in full and all associated documents are duly signed. This paperwork includes the application for Right to Burial and a signature on the checklist for understanding cemetery gravesite ownership.
7. No burial is permitted without evidence of a "Certificate of Right of Burial" which is issued when the burial plot has been purchased and paid in full.
8. No burial is permitted until all applicable fee assessments/payments have been made for all associated costs of burial.
9. Fees for opening and closing a grave are to be paid to the trustee appointed sub-contractor(s).
