

Flowers and Gravesite Regulations

These regulations protect cemetery grounds, staff, visitors, wildlife, and the equipment used to keep the cemetery grounds safe. The regulations also help to limit groundskeeping costs.



Flowers and Permitted Plant Stands

Flowers can be placed in a substantial pot in an above ground plant stand. Please remove the sales tag from the pot. Please choose a pot that will protect the plant from the heat.

A *permitted* plant stand is 36" tall and is constructed of steel, iron, aluminum, or other similar material and consists of only one supporting stake without legs. The stake is topped with metal supports designed to hold a flowerpot. The base should be a flat metal square or circle (approximately 10 to 12 inches). This helps to keep the stand flush to the ground and in a vertical position. Mower blades will not run into the base or the pole supporting the planter. The 36" height allows the mower to follow a path evenly. Only one plant is permitted per gravesite.

Seasonal Regulation for Flowers

Flowers (live or artificial) are allowed from April through October. All artificial plants must be removed by the end of October. Live and artificial plants must be replaced when dead, faded, damaged, or destroyed.

Memorial Day -- Beginning on the Friday before Memorial Day, the cemetery will allow placement of all types of floral displays, including cut flowers, artificial flowers, wreaths, and flags. Temporary displays can stay in place for one week until the weekend after Memorial Day. Cemetery staff will remove all temporary displays after that week. If you wish to keep your decoration, please remove it within the allotted time.

Christmas and Winter displays are allowed during the winter season. Winter displays must be removed by April 1st (weather permitting).
