Read Proverbs 6:6 and Proverbs 14:23

How did your family of origin view work? How has that shaped your attitude toward earning today?

Colossians 3:23 says our work is ultimately for the Lord. What changes when we stop seeing work as just a paycheck and start seeing it as worship? How does working “for the Lord” change the way you approach jobs, especially those you do not enjoy or feel unnoticed in?

Carey Nieuwhof says entitlement kills gratitude. Where do you see entitlement showing up in our culture or your own family? What are some ways you can intentionally fight entitlement?

Read Proverbs 3:9–10, Proverbs 11:25 and 2 Corinthians 9:7

What makes generous giving difficult, even for people who believe it is biblical? What is the connection between trust and joy when we give beyond what is expected?

Read Matthew 6:3–4

Why do you think God values quiet generosity? How does giving in secret shape humility and trust in God rather than dependence on human approval?

Read Proverbs 21:20 and Proverbs 13:11

What habits or mindsets help people practice patience instead of impulse when it comes to money? What does wise saving communicate about faith, patience and preparation for the future?

Read Ecclesiastes 5:10–11

Where have you seen “more” fail to deliver contentment in your own life? What practical steps can families take to teach contentment instead of constant comparison or consumption?

Read Philippians 4:12–13

What does it look like to practice contentment in a culture built on constant upgrades and comparison?
