November 30, 2025**

Begin by reading Psalm 145

Which attribute in Psalm 145 stands out most to you right now—God's compassion, patience, provision, nearness, or protection? Why?

The sermon used astronomical scale—the Sun, Betelgeuse, Mu Cephei, Canis Majoris—to help us understand the vast greatness of God. What part of creation most stirs your sense of God's majesty?

Ted urged us to “Stop obsessing over the size of your problems and start declaring the greatness of your God.” What's one practical way to shift from anxiety to worship this week? How does the vastness of creation (galaxies, stars, distances, etc.) help recalibrate your perspective on your own problems?

Why is it vital to pass on stories of God's faithfulness—both biblical and personal—to the next generation?

Often we encounter God in the most powerful ways when we are hurting or desperate. Share about a time when have you experienced God's nearness most clearly.

The God who created the stars is also the God who sees and saves individuals. How does the gospel help you hold together both God's greatness and His personal care for each of His children? Why are both important?

Seeing the immensity of creation should humble us. How does a right view of God's greatness guard us from pride, entitlement, or self-importance?

Psalm 145 says God's greatness “no one can fathom.” Why is it good for our souls to accept that God is beyond full human understanding?
