Bread of Life (Fightin' Words Ya'll)

Read Exodus 3:14 and John 6:35

- Why were the first two words of Jesus statement considered “fightin words” by many of the Jews and “bloody words” by Charles Spurgeon? (Read **John 19:7**)
- David said Jesus’s claim to be “the” Bread of Life is the essence of the Bible. Why is “the” much more exclusive than “a” bread?
- Is there another “bread” that you have put above “the Bread”, effectively placing someone or something else as your object of worship?

To better understand the context of John 6:35, **read John 6:1-15** and his interaction with the crowd the following day in **John 6:26-34**.

- David said most of the crowd was pursuing the healings rather than the “Healer.” What evidence from the context supports his statement?
- The first day Jesus found people who had momentary need and fed them without condition. He “wrapped the Gospel in a fish sandwich.” The next day, why did David say Jesus was focused on the people’s eternal need?
- How does Jesus’s approach compare to short-term mission trips, other service projects, and daily “presenting the Gospel on a platter of service”?

David related the story of how he and his wife, Jennifer, led the hotel housekeeper, Rhonda, to the Lord after her heart had been prepared by the youth group staying at the hotel. Do you have a similar story of being led to Christ or leading someone else to Christ?

Read 1 Peter 3:15. Pray that we would serve the Rhonda’s in our lives and recognize opportunities to share with them the hope we have in Christ.

Discussion Questions
