Read Job 34:3

Read Proverbs 12:18, Proverbs 15:4 and Proverbs 16:24

What guidance do we find in these verses as it pertains to our words? Can you share about a time when words either crushed your spirit or brought healing?

Read Proverbs 15

Make a list of all the ways this proverb addresses how we hear or share words. Does anything stand out as an area you need to personally improve?

Read Proverbs 29:5 and Luke 6:26

Why is flattery so dangerous?

Read 2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Timothy 4:1-3 and Psalm 141:5

How are we challenged to apply The Word of God in our everyday life? How hard is it for you to receive correction or rebuke? How difficult is it for you to have hard conversations with others?
