BACK TO THE BIBLE

Annual Voter's Meeting Minutes 1/30/2022

Call to Order: 9:15 a. m. by Jan Larson

Opening Prayer: Pastor Clark

Agenda: Reviewed and approved.

Pastor's Report: Along with Pastor's written report some highlights were: He really appreciates that Paul & Abi Nelson are here. Everything Paul does has a purpose. He wants to know the families of the youth group and he wants to support the church family. Stacy Rutten held a class on Giftedness. She posted 6 different gifts around the room and the Staff Member was to stand by the gift they had. There were 6 different gifts and there were 6 Staff Members in attendance—each one at a different place. New Member Class will be on February 5 with about 18 in the group. Grateful for the Debenture Program. Lent & Easter coming soon as Easter is late this year. Thanks to all who took time to have their pictures taken. There is still time to do that all you need to do is call the church office.

Children & Family Ministry and Noah's

Ark: Kelly provided a written report.

Youth Ministry: Paul received help for his report from Vicar Ryan for the first part of the year and then reported the final 2 months on his own with highlights on the youth event from last July to Mexico, Missouri. The youth had many projects to do. This Summer the youth mission trip is to Rosebud Reservation. Mission trip cost is estimated at \$15,000. Heggie's pizza had record sales last year. Hoping this year will go as well. Youth will be helping with Lenten Suppers again this year. 7th grade confirmation is done for the year with the 8th grade confirmation on a pause until after Easter.

Special Ministries: Along with Katherine's written report some highlights were: assisting new members with getting connected-servicing and/or in life groups. Reaching out to our visitors. Restarted the Youth

Board. Launching Website – January 2022. Staff Retreat, DCE call committee, & organ committee advisor. Snowbirds who still want to get their pictures taken should give the church office a call to set up a time. Outreach Board Events: Trick or Treat, Noah's Ark Parent Appreciation, Lunch for GriefShare. Outreach combined Evangelism & Missions. Life Groups this past year had 20 different leaders and 18 different studies. Some of the leaders were couples.

Secretary's Report: In the Special Ministries there is a sentence that says there is a newly formed Youth Group. The correction to that is it should read: Youth Board not Youth Group. With the amendment change a motion to accept the minutes with the change was made by Lois Borner and seconded by Tony Sabraski. Minutes were approved.

Financial Secretary & Treasurer's Report: Reports presented by Jim Chapa & Amy Klemz. Reports were reconciled. General Fund through December 31, 2021 the Final Quarter:

Contributions	\$254,521
Expenses	\$236,387
Net Income	\$ 18,134

God has Blessed St. John's with a YTD surplus of \$69,589. Jim said that last year the Actual YTD total was \$750,000 and this year ended with \$866,681. This was through the Pandemic. This was a bountiful year. There is an over budget amount of \$7,000 approved by a motion from Penny Steele and seconded by Jed Larson to send this money to the District for Missions. A surplus of \$270K moved to earn interest. The Insurance Company looking to raise our premiums was shown a handbook about our Preschool. Being impressed by it our premiums were lowered. Breeze program brought in 19% for the 2021 year. A motion to approve the Financial Report was made by Bill Elletson and seconded by Ed Borner. It was passed. Thank you to Jim for all your work.

Elders Report: Ryan Rutten reported that Russ Hill, Matt Russell, and Tom Merrick have been added to the Elder board. They are replacing Kyle Bjork, Gabe Licht, and Mark Saunders. A list of Members removed & received are printed in the packet. A motion was made by Janice Marschel and seconded by Jan Larson. Elders are in contact with members who haven't been seen recently and have found that COVID is keeping some of them away. Fellowship Board has an opening for anyone. Submit your names to Ryan Rutten. What effectiveness does the Liturgical Service have? There are 2000 baptized; Active: 500. The Elders are striving to have every member be present at Church for enriching their faith walk. Removing inactive members only at their request.

Proposed Mission Projects: For 2022 the Mission Projects have stayed the same as last year for the Lenten Season. Special days through Lent are Ash Wednesday; Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, & Easter have envelopes. There is also Thanksgiving & Christmas. Two other offering opportunities are Josh & Whitney Smith Missionaries and LOVE, INC. previously approved. New projects this year are Wrapped in Love, Buffalo Mission & St. Cloud Pregnancy Resource Center. Donations of clothing for children through adult. ST. John's provides the sock and underwear & the rest is donations. Thrivent Action cards can be utilized by each member in Thrivent being able to get up to two cards a year to use for an event.
