MOSES Ministry

"Sure! Just let me know the time and place." Since working with our MOSES project, the generous nature of members is clear. Projects differ in extent, time and help levels, but all are valuable. MOSES is normally meant for smaller tasks a person can't complete on their own, usually one or two times. MOSES volunteers are all ages. Sometimes entire families help.

When calling on behalf of MOSES, I've never received a "no, I don't feel like it." One even offered to reschedule a personal dental appointment if I couldn't find other help. To paraphrase Pastor Clark, he says he asks that God show him ways to be of service each day. Many members embody this. The most common MOSES interaction I've gotten is from potential volunteers wondering why I'm not calling them for service. So don't hesitate to call.

Peoples' caring nature has even brought me to tears. In a recent example, a member needed a ride to and from a 6 plus hour Minneapolis appointment. Due to the time, I determined a separate pick-up and drop-off may be best. I called a member who agreed immediately, but thought he should drive her to and from the hospital, and stay during the appointment. This had a profound effect. After our MOSES conversation, I had renewed proof of God's power and greater hope. I just learned the first appointment was several hours longer than planned and there are several upcoming appointments to which the MOSES volunteer is driving her. This aids many, perhaps even people at the hospital. Because, the world sees what people are doing in the name of Jesus through projects like MOSES and other missions. I am confident this makes an impact, and can be one of the best things we can do for the world.

It also means asking for help can be a positive for more than just you. It gives our Christian brothers and sisters ways to be of service. It also gives the world a chance to see the light of a person working for Jesus. So like I stated earlier, do not hesitate to call.






