### From the Desk of Pastor Clark

For unto us a child is born,
unto us a Son is given:
and the government shall be upon His shoulder:
and His name shall be called
Wonderful Counsellor,
The mighty God,
The everlasting Father,
The Prince of Peace.

Isaiah 9:6

I read a story a few years back about a 4 year-old boy named Bobby Tufts who was "elected" mayor of Dorset, Minnesota (population 22). Although, in a community that size, there aren't that many responsibilities, when this preschool-aged mayor would be seen walking up and down the street with his parents, he would be greeted to calls of "Good morning, Mr. Mayor!" You could say that the government of this tiny community was upon his tiny shoulders!

In Isaiah 9, we have one of the most amazing prophecies of Jesus. "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given." This was fulfilled 2000 years ago when Jesus was born in Bethlehem, sent here to earth to save us from our sins. Then the next line of Isaiah says, "and the government shall be upon His shoulder." 




