Finance Committee

Highlights

- We have started the process of building the 2024 Budget. All committees should have submitted their first drafts to Dana and the Finance Committee.
- Once the Finance Committee receives all committee proposals, we will combine them into the whole church budget and make adjustments as needed. The final budget will be available to the congregation.
- A major consideration for the 2024 budget will be our ability to pay our full share of Conference, District and Pension Apportionments. Keep in mind, our 2023 budget is not paying our full share. We paid \$42,335 less in apportionments in 2023. We feel it's important to return to paying the full apportionment amount.
- September 2023 net operating loss is \$6,071.
- Pledges and envelope contributions are about the same as in August.
- In the month of September, we received \$310 in plate offerings.
- Total operations expenses for September were \$39,607. This is \$2,260 less than August.
- Year To Date (YTD) gross profit is 71.7% of the full year budget whereas expenses are 75% of the full year budget. September YTD represents 75% of the full year budget, so profit is falling behind budget and expenses are at budget. The gap between income and expenses has gotten smaller since July when we went to only one full-time pastor. It seems to be settling at about 3%. If we can increase income, we will be close to a balanced budget.
