CENTRAL DOCTRINES OF CHRISTIANITY - Dr. Christian Miller

Have you ever wondered what the idea of the Trinity means? How can Jesus be both God and man at the same time? What is the idea of original sin, and how does Jesus atone for our sins? This class will explore the central beliefs that are at the heart of our faith, and that are shared by all Christians. We will look at the trinity, original sin, incarnation, atonement, grace, resurrection, and heaven/hell. No background is assumed and there will be lots of opportunity for discussion (much of which will be lively)!

Christian is a professor of Philosophy at Wake Forest, and has taught an undergraduate course on this subject for a number of years.

HAND IN HAND MINISTRY

The adult hand-in-hand class started a new curriculum this fall called "Awe and Wonder" based on Psalm 65:8 which says "the whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders". This curriculum follows the big story of Jesus, the Old Testament in the fall and the New Testament in the spring. We have adaptive levels, hand on activities and brightly colored visuals to teach concepts. We'd love to have you join!

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CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

This fall in Sunday school, our children will continue their journey through God's big story using interactive games, reflective wondering, dramatic storytelling, art! All classes meet on the Children's Ministry hall, except for the 4th and 5th grade class which meets in The Community Room (in the basement beneath the CM hall).

Before Sunday School, all 4 year olds, kindergartners, and 1st-5th graders will meet in our Worship Room for Kids' Praise! We will enjoy praising our Creator while learning new songs, some of which we will share with the congregation in worship service throughout the year!

YOUTH MINISTRY

Both will meet in the Sanders House
(3 houses down from the main church building on Miller St.)

Middle schoolers are diving into what it really means to worship God. Worship is more than singing songs on Sunday, it's about knowing who God is, responding to what He has done, and learning to live our whole lives for Him. Through Scripture, discussion, and hands-on activities, students will explore the different parts of worship and discover why we gather, why we confess, how God speaks to us through His Word, what the sacraments remind us of, and why God sends us back into the world.

High schoolers are reading through the Psalms and discovering what it looks like to bring their whole selves to God. Each week, students will explore a different Psalm and ask what the writer is experiencing, what the Psalm reveals about who God is, and how that truth changes the way we respond to what we're facing. We'll also see how the Psalms point us to Jesus, the One who understands our deepest emotions, meets us in them, and gives us lasting hope.
